Breakfast At Tiffany's

Movie fans can finally have 'Breakfast at Tiffany's', or even lunch, with the opening of The Blue Box Café at Tiffany & Co's flagship Fifth Ave store. The café, located on the fourth floor is open for breakfast, lunch and afternoon tea. The café, of course, features Tiffany blue walls, couches, table clothes and China and offers diners views over the city's iconic Central Park.

Getting There

From 21 Mar, HA will offer five flights a week northbound to NYC's JFK airport via HNL. Clients can fly on HA 446 ex AKL 2355 Wed-Sun, connecting to domestic flight (HA 50) arriving NYC at 0655 the next day. "This means travellers have a full day up their sleeve with which to get the body clocks set to local time before a good night's sleep," says HA. A HNL stopover is said to be popular with southbound Kiwis.

HA offers JFK open jaw options from HA's 11 west coast mainland cities. Clients can connection with HA's partner carrier JetBlue (which offers a wide range destinations from its JFK hub to other west coast US points) then fly HA back to Hawaii and AKL.

On The Run

NYC has more than 600 LinkNYC kiosks offering free high-speed internet, phone calls, and device charging. All 279 NYC underground subway stations have free wifi and full cellular coverage.

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
