A Guide To Hawaii's Mixology Month

For guests heading to Hawaii this month, *Travel Today* has a guide of the best places to stop for both a drink and a bite in Waikiki, as The International Market Place celebrates its annual mixology month. At Eating House 1849 by Roy Yamaguchi, clients can enjoy Kona Brewing Company Big Wave, smoked ahi dip and pipikaula and poi from USD5; while USD10 can get them a Kunia Spritz or Hawaiian Martini, Szechuan spiced baby back ribs and Mongolian chicken lumpia.

At Flour & Barley the Waikiki Royal cocktail is now USD5, as are pupus (bar snacks) such as garlic bread and meatballs. On the USD10 menu is the Pearl Margarita and Makapuu Mule cocktails as well as calamari fritte, margherita pizza and big apple pizza. Also worth a stop is Herringbone, which boasts a USD5 menu with Gold

Duct Woman and Provence Rose cocktails as well as bacon mac'n'cheese bites and oysters rockefeller; and a USD10 menu with Smashin Passion and South of Istanbul cocktails and pupus like truffle parmesan fries.

Stripsteak Waikiki's highlights include Summertime Strawberry Shooters and sliders for USD5; while USD5 pina coladas are at The Street Food Hall by Michael Mina and Kaku's Sushi & Seafood Buffet has a USD5 cocktail menu with mai tai, margarita and pina coladas.
