## Uncover Lanai, Hawaii's Little Gem



Only 14km from Maui the island of Lanai can feel like it's a world away; and while it's the smallest inhabited island in Hawaii, it offers a multitude of activities catering to all types of travellers.

The island itself is home to 29km of coastline, ready to explore. Highlighted stops include Hulope Bay for snorkelling, Puu Pehe Beach (pictured) is a short hike away and is a great picnic spot and the pristine Polihua Beach is recommended for clients looking for an adventure, and some privacy—it's more often than not empty of people.

The destination also offers a wealth of trails to wow any hiker. For a challenge, try the Munro Trail. The trail begins at Four Seasons Resort Lai and ventures through mountains, grasslands and rainforest before

climbing to the peak of Lanaihale (1027m). Also recommended is Lanai Adventures woodland horseback rides and clay shooting at Lanai Archery and Shooting Range.

On the water, agents can recommend sunrise and sunset sails as well as whale watching tours with Lanai Ocean Sports.

### ... Five Star Food

Lanai is also highlighted for its food, being home to both mom-and-pop cafes in Lanai City and high-end resort restaurants. Recommended spots to grab a bite include Blue Ginger Cafe, Cafe 565 and Richard's Market in Lanai City. Those looking for some romance are advised to head the Lanai City Grille.

#### . . . Where To Stay

For luxury, there is the Four Seasons Resort Lanai. It overlooks marine reserve Hulopoe Bay, which is perfect for snorkelling and swimming with green sea turtles, spinner dolphins and colourful reef fish. For avid golfers, two world-ranked courses are on offer, and a spa .

Alternatively, clients can stay at the recently renovated Hotel Lanai, located in the heart of Lanai City. The 1930s era hotel boasts only 11 rooms, as well as a restaurant.
