## Kiwis Key To Coastal Clean Ups



Hawaii Island's southeast coast is a hot bed for plastic waste, but this is about to change thanks to New Zealand non-profit Sea Cleaners. The Hawaiian Sea Cleaners initiative was devised by The Walshe Group's Darragh Walshe and began with a conversation with Hayden Smith who heads the non-profit Sea Cleaners organisation.

Darragh, who is pictured above (right) with Hayden in action, says the concept was based around recognising the connection Kiwis have with Hawaii across the Pacific, and the impact that plastics are having, 'not only in our own back-yard but throughout the Pacific Ocean as they are carried by wind and tide'.

Last year, in conjunction with Hawaiian Airlines, a group of Kiwi youth ambassadors travelled to Hawaii to participate in International Coast Clean-up Day and also to talk to schools to focus on the issue and share ideas; with a group from Hawaii then coming to New Zealand earlier this year.

Darragh says the initiative made an impact with other Hawaii Tourism offices, with Australian and Japan also joining in—as well as the Hawaiian Airlines ohana.

"Nat Geo also came on board, filming

the initiative as part of an *Eco Traveller* series focussing on responsible and sustainable tourism,"he adds.

The itinerary included beach cleans on a remote coast on the Island of Hawaii, school visits and aligned tourism experiences including a visit to Puuhonua o Honaunau an Waipi'o Valley and the group was hosted by Sheraton Kona Resort & Spa Keauhou Bay.

Hayden says the Sea Cleaners work is for 'our children and our children's children'."We must make changes now to the way we operate our daily lives without wasted consumption," says Hayden. HA echoes these sentiments. "As the hometown carrier for 90 years, we understand the tremendous responsibility we have in caring for these Islands," says Debbie Nakanelua-Richards, HA's director of community and cultural relations. "Our hope this International Coastal Clean-up Day is to bring people together to malama honua (care for our Island Earth) and inspire others." HA's Rusty Williss (left) was also up on Hawaii Island for the initiative and is pictured planting a native 'Ulu tree (or breadfruit) 'with aloha' in Waipi'o Valley on the island's northern coast.
