## One Day Is NOT Enough

One-day Disneyland passes are still available, but given there's now over 100 attractions across the two parks one day is really not long enough to experience the parks—especially during the summer peak. Clients looking for some guidance should be urged to at least consider a two- or three-day Park Hopper pass, which give them the freedom to change between the two parks.

As well as the huge number of rides and attractions both parks now offer incredible seasonal night-time shows.



## ... More Enjoyable

For those travelling with families, and who have the time, suggest upgrading to a five-day ticket to allow the whole family to really enjoy the park. Speaking from personal experience, having the option of more time in the park takes the pressure off the whole family and makes it easier to break up the days. For example spend the morning in the parks, head back for a swim at the hotel to avoid the afternoon peak, and then go back into the parks in the evening and take in one of the shows.

Disney Destination's Rick Youngman says for many Kiwis the Disneyland Resort is part of their Southern California itinerary, and reinforces the benefits of upgrading to a longer parks pass. "People might want to spend a couple of days in the parks and then head to SeaWorld another day—but with [a longer pass] they can come back into Disneyland that night and grab an ice-cream and watch the fireworks," he says.

## Disneyland Where Dreams Come True



There's nothing like watching the wonder and awe in a child's face as they step into the world of Disney at the Anaheim theme parks. As a parent it's a combination of that priceless look and a lifetime of your own Disney memories rolled into one—and for many Kiwi families it really is a trip of a lifetime.

### Strollers For Under Fives

Even if clients are staying in a Disneyland Hotel urge families with children under five years to take or hire a stroller (push chair). There's lots of walking to do across both the Disney parks and a stroller comes in very handy to ferry little people from one ride to another, to put things in, and even as something for kids to hold on to as you negotiate the crowds. Strollers, with ample storage, are available for hire for USD15 per day outside the Disneyland Park Main Entrance. The strollers can be used in both Disney Parks, but cannot be taken into the Downtown Disney shopping and dining precinct.

in a growing number of Kiwi families heading to the Magic Kingdom.

This week the Disneyland Resort California Adventure Park will unveil some major new developments giving clients more reasons to visit, or revisit, the Magic Kingdom.

*Travel Today*, and three junior reporters, will be there to report on the launch of Disney California Adventure's new 12 acre Cars Land, the opening of the Buena Vista Street experience and the new Carthay Theatre—as well as news and updates from across the two parks.

## Matterhorn Refurb

Disneyland is constantly re-imagining the parks and from time to time this leads to attraction closures. Suggest clients check the Disneyland website for details about which rides are closed during their visit to avoid disappointment. At the moment the Matterhorn Bobsled attraction is closed for refurbishment.

## Magic Mornings At DCA

From 18 Jun, Disney California Adventure Park will offer early magic morning entry on a Mon, Wed and Fri. The 'Extra Magic Hour' pre-park opening applies to clients staying in a Disneyland Resort hotel. Those buying a three-day or longer parks pass will also get one free Magic Morning entry. Disneyland offers Magic Morning entry for select attractions Sun, Tue, Thu and Sat. Guests must have a valid park ticket and hotel room key card, and urge them to arrive 75mins before the park opens.

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## Disney Junior – Live

Disney continues to attract new generations of fans through its story telling—including the shows on its Disney Junior television channel. These characters come alive at the Disney Junior Live On Stage show at Disney California Adventure. The newest addition to the line up is Jake and the Neverland Pirates as well as the stars from Mickey Mouse Clubhouse, Handy Manny and Little Einsteins. There are regular performances throughout the day. See the entertainment schedule for details.



## Character Greetings

Disney doesn't specify when characters will be where, but as a general rule: Mickey and friends can be found in Toon Town (go early to avoid long lines); the Disney Princesses and Alice in Wonderland characters in Fantasy Land; and Pooh and friends in Critter Country. Also keep an eye out for Mickey and Minnie at Time Square outside the Mad Hatter Shop (on the right inside the Disneyland entrance as you head to Main Street). Over at Disney California Adventure Disney characters can be spotted at the Hollywood Pictures Backlot and the Sunshine Plaza.

# California Adventure Comes Of Age



The Disney California Park will come of age this Fri with the launch of a new land, new attractions and a new look, including the addition of a new park icon, the Carthay Circle Theatre and Restaurant (pictured above).

Disney opened the second Anaheim park in 2001 with three lands. Later this week, following the opening of a new Cars Land (more on that later this week) and a new 1920s themed Buena Vista Street area, Disney California Adventure will boast a total of eight themed lands—and a whole new feel. It's hoped the developments will firmly establish Disney California Adventure as a must-do Disney park in its own right—now offering a full range of attractions for the young to adventurous and even fine dining.

## ... Buena Vista Street

Visitors entering Disney California Adventure will be transported back to Hollywood in the 1920s—the way Walt would've seen it. The park en-

trance has been transformed and the giant CALIFORNIA letters have gone. Passing by the historic Red Car Trolleys, park guests will enter the new Buena Vista Street Precinct. The new precinct is California Adventure's answer to Main Street in Disneyland and with classic Disney storytelling, visitors are transported back to a bygone era.

## Dining Now On-line

Agents with Disneyland-bound clients can now book their Disney character dining experiences on-line. There's a host of options across the parks and hotels and character dining is ideal for clients who are short on time, or for a gentle introduction for kids who are a little wary of the characters. Bookings must be made within 60 days of departure and can be made in 10-min. intervals. Agents need to provide the client's name, contact phone number, the number of adults and children and if a high chair is required. Clients can also request Bibbidi Bobbidi Boutique and Disney 365 (both makeover options for young princesses) through the same e-mail address. E-mail reservations to dine@disneyland.com

## Starbucks At Disney

The first Starbucks will open in a Disney park this week. Located in the Fiddle, Fifer and Practical Café (characters from the Three Little Pigs) along the park's new Buena Vista Street there will be no Starbucks branding outside, but it will serve Starbucks coffee and food inside—with some Disney menu options.

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## Time Saver Tips

Disneyland's attractions are hugely popular—and with that popularity often come queues. But there's some easy tips to reduce the time spent queuing. The most popular is the Disney Fastpass system which allows guests to get a ticket to come back to one of the more popular rides during a specified time window. Urge clients to get the easy-to-use Fastpass tickets early in the day as there's only a limited number allocated daily.

Tell them to look for the Fastpass distribution area near the entrance of the Fastpass attractions (listed below). Insert the park admission ticket into the Fastpass machine and a Fastpass ticket will be printed with the return time. Tell clients to remember to check the Fastpass return time clock for when to return to the attraction (it's normally a window of 90 mins or so). Clients can only have one Fastpass at each park at a time.

## ... Fastpass Rides

At Disneyland the rides are: Autopia; Big Thunder Mountain Railroad; Indiana Jones; Roger Rabbit's Car Toon Spin; Space Mountain; Splash Mountain; and Star Tours. Over at Disney California Adventure the Fastpass rides are: California Screamin'; Goofy's Sky School; Grizzly River Run; Radiator Springs Racers (to be distributed near 'It's Tough to Be a Bug'), Soarin' Over California and the Tower of Terror. There's also a Fastpass for the World of Color nighttime spectacular.

## Get In Early

The queues tend to build up through the day so urge clients to head to the more popular rides first thing. It also generally gets quieter at attractions over lunch and when parades are on.

## The Magic Continues At Disneyland



**The transformation of Disney California Adventure has been under the spotlight, but across at Disneyland the magic continues.**

Rides such as It's A Small World and the Mad Tea Party (the tea cups ride) continue to delight visitors of all ages, while other favourites such as Star Tours (the Star Wars ride) have been revamped to add a new dimension—literally.

The popular Star Tours attraction 3D re-opened at Disneyland last year and now utilises the latest imaging technology to transport visitors right into scenes from the *Star Wars* movies. There's also now more than 50 ride combinations, so clients can

ride it again and again—each time experiencing a new adventure. Meanwhile, the Matterhorn Bobsleds, which originally opening in 1959 will re-open at Disneyland this Fri following a 'refresh', complete with new three-person bob-sleds that will allow guests to be seated individually.

## ... Newcomers

There's also a couple of new faces at Disneyland. Merida, the lead character of the new Disney-Pixar film *Brave* now offers a meet and greet near It's A Small World, and from Oct Periwinkle will join Tinkerbell and her fairy friends at Pixie Hollow.



## Live From Disney

Reporting Live: *Travel Today's* junior reporters have been doing some field research today—largely around Disneyland's Toon Town and Tomorrowland. We also took advantage of Disney's Magic Mornings (which lets Disney Hotel guests, or those buying a three-day parks pass or longer, enter the park an hour earlier on selected days). We managed to ride straight into Tomorrowland on the Monorail from Downtown Disney, ride the Finding Nemo submarines, try out the Buzz Lightyear Astroblasters before the park opened as well as get the jump on some of the popular Fantasyland rides before the lines built-up. A highlight for our junior journos, pictured above, was meeting Mickey Mouse in Toon Town.

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## Disney Photopass

The Disney Photopass is a unique way to get professional park photos of the whole family to ensure the 'magical memories' last forever. Disney has photographers stationed at key locations across both parks and visitors simply grab one of the photo pass cards and get it scanned each time they get a Photopass picture. All those pictures can be viewed at the photo supplies store at the bottom of Main Street USA and a picture, including a quirky Disney border is from around USD14. For those looking to get all the photos on their Photopass, they can buy the full image CD—which does come at a premium, around USD169.

## A Soundsational Parade

Mickey's New Soundsational Parade down Main Street USA opened in the park last month and features over 90 performers, including a number of popular Disney characters performing a giant jam session. Urge clients with children to pick a spot early along the parade way (which is roped off before the parades begin) to ensure they get a good view.

## Disneyland Hotel Gets A Revamp



The two-year upgrade of the Disneyland Hotel is complete and the iconic hotel is boasting a whole new look and feel. As well as refurbished rooms there's now three pools and slides, new bars and restaurants and nostalgic Disney enhancements.

The refreshed property is ideal for families. Rooms sleep up to five and the Disney experience begins at check-in—with surprise character visits, tea-cup themed seats and even a Disney movie area for the little ones.

The rooms feature Disney touches and at night-time the magic continues with in-room fireworks...in the form of twinkling fibre lights which light-up over a castle across a giant headboard.

Some of the hotel rooms also offer a view of the nightly Disneyland fireworks as an added bonus.

The hotel is located at the end of Downtown Disney, a short walk from the parks and guests can take the

monorail right into Tomorrowland (a park ticket and hotel room key is required).

Urge families to take advantage of the Magic Mornings early entry for Disney Hotel guests and then return to the new pool and water play area later in the day. There's two larger water slides and a smaller two-lane mini-slide.



## One More Sleep To Go

There's just one more sleep to go until the junior reporters get to try out Cars Land. The new 12-acre development is entirely themed around the Disney-Pixar Cars movie and features three family-friendly new attractions (think flying tyres, dancing tractors and a race car race-off) along with new shops, dining options and surprises. In the build-up the junior reporters have been perfecting their driving skills at Autopia in Disneyland (pictured).

## Main St Sneak Peak

For clients with limited time, the shops along Main Street USA in Disneyland usually open around 30 minutes before the rest of the park. It's also a great time to head to the bottom of Main Street USA and grab a photo with the Sleeping Beauty Castle as a backdrop with no or few people in the frame.

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## Fireworks Tips

Taking in the Disneyland fireworks is a Disney must-do. The nightly Magical fireworks show is still breath-taking and urge guests looking to get the best view to head anywhere along Main Street USA so they have Sleeping Beauty's castle as the backdrop.

For those looking to catch the sky high show without entering the park, there's a number of vantage points around the area. Clients can also book 'fireworks seats' for dinner or dessert at Catal Restaurant in Downtown Disney. They suggest booking 30 mins prior to the fireworks start time.

## Shopping, Dining At Downtown Disney




The vibrant Downtown Disney precinct, located adjacent to the parks, is a shopping and dining area by day, and transforms into a popular entertainment precinct by night.

For families there's restaurants including the themed Rainforest Café as well as interactive shops such as the Build A Bear Workshop and Ride Makers (a new 'build your own car' shop). The area is also home to the second largest Lego shop in the US (where Lego is said to be priced less than half what it is in New Zealand). The revamped shop now features huge handmade Lego Disney characters and a Lego building area complete with a car racing track—that's very popular with younger children.

On the dining front the refurbished Uva bar offers a wide selection of drinks, including Tangerine beer, and a range of tapas billed as value for money and designed to be shared.

For sports fans the ESPN zone (pictured right) screens almost every

known sporting code there is and games, including All Blacks tests, can be booked to watch on one of the televisions. There's a bar, dining and a games area upstairs. Other notable fixtures are The House of Blues, which hosts regular concerts and there are a number of restaurants including Tortilla Jo's and Naples which offer express takeaway options, a cheaper and quicker alternative to dining in.



## Height Requirements

Due to the nature of the rides a number of Disneyland Resort attractions have height restrictions—but basically by the age of four-ish (or 102cm) children can get on most of the rides. A full list of height restrictions is at [Disneyland.com](http://Disneyland.com), but here's a quick guide:

Disneyland rides min. height: 82cm accompanied on Autopia; 89cm on Gadget's Go Coaster and the Matterhorn Bobsled (currently closed for refurb); 102 cm on Big Thunder Mountain Railroad, Space Mountain, Splash Mountain and Star Tours. There's a 117cm requirement for Indiana Jones and to ride Autopia alone, 137cm.

At Disney California Adventure min. heights are: 82cm if accompanied by another rider on Luigi's Flying Tires and Mater's Junkyard Jamboree (both opening 15 Jun); 91cm on the Tuck and Roll's Drive Em Buggies; at least 102cm on Jumpin' Jellyfish, Radiator Springs Racers, Silly Symphony Swings (tandem), Soarin' Over California and the Tower of Terror. The min. height is 106cm for Grizzly River Run, the Redwood Creek Trail, California Screamin' and solo on Silly Symphony Swings.

## Disney's Health Tick

Disney last week introduced a new 'Mickey Check' tool which helps parents identify nutritious foods at its parks and resorts, and will start appearing on licensed food products and menus by the end of the year. The move is the latest in Disney's aim to help parents inspire kids to lead healthier lifestyles.

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## Get There Early

Demand for Cars Land and the new attractions is expected to be high, so urge clients to get to the area and rides early before the queues build up. It may also pay to remind clients buying a three-day or longer pass that, from Mon, their one Magic Morning early entry may be taken at Disney California Adventure. For details see Disneyland.com



## Radiator Springs Racers

Without a doubt the star of Cars Land has got to be the Radiator Springs Racers. Billed as one of the largest and most elaborate attractions created for a Disney theme park, the new ride features a host of memorable elements which combine to deliver an incredible journey, and race, through Radiator Springs' Ornament Valley.

Without giving too much away guests board one of the Cars family to take a tour of the highlights, and personalities, in Radiator Springs before getting a pre-race makeover at Luigi's tires or Ramone's House of Body Art (there are two versions). After a pep talk from Doc Hudson the cars are propelled into a race through the spectacular backdrop of Ornament Valley. With fun, surprises, characters, scenery and speed this ride really has it all and should be a must-do for all Disneyland visitors.

## Cars Land Premiere: The Wait Is Over

With blinking neon, a backlit mountain range and classic rock music inspired by Route 66, Radiator Springs came to life last night for those attending the Cars Land Premiere in Disney California Adventure.

There has been a huge amount of hype and build-up around the launch of the new themed land, which can make it tough to be impressed, but last night Cars Land failed to disappoint on any level.

Walking through the main street of Radiator Springs is really like stepping into the movie. The depth of detail and clever car puns add to the ambience and showcase Disney's ability to connect people of all ages through storytelling.

"The crown jewel of our Disney Cali-

fornia Adventure expansion, Cars Land is the extraordinary result of a close collaboration between the gifted filmmakers at Pixar Animation Studios and our talented Imagineers and cast members." The Walt Disney Company chairman and chief executive officer Bob Iger told those at last night's event. "It's also a spectacular example of our ability to take our characters and stories and bring them to life in new and unexpected ways."

## Sarge and Ramone's

Sarge's Surplus Hut and Radiator Springs Curios both offer Cars-themed merchandise, along with Ramone's House of Body Art. There's a plethora of new Cars-related items available, including collectable items.



## Car-acters

New Car-themed performers are taking to the streets of Radiator Springs when Cars Land opens in Disney California Adventure this Fri California time. As well as Lightning McQueen and Mater a host of other car-acters will be making an appearance. DJ, the ultimate party car (pictured), will entertain park visitors with giant speakers, a built-in disc changer and his very own party crew—staging impromptu dance parties. Meanwhile, another car-acter Red the Fire Truck will be in Cars Land looking to recruit volunteers to help water the flowers and clean-up Radiator Springs—but prepare to get wet, warn Disney insiders.

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## Sally's Cozy Cone Motel

Dining out at one of the five giant orange cones that make up Sally's Cozy Cone Motel is a feast for the senses. Offering five different cone-inspired take-out dishes, there's pop cone (pop corn), ice-cream cones, chile cone quesco and other cone-coctions such as churros. The concept adds a little fun to the meals and guests can even sit under orange cone shaped umbrellas to eat their snacks.

Other options include Fillmore's Taste-in with offerings including the 'high-octane' health benefits of fresh fruits, bottled water and juices. There's also Flo's V8 café, open for breakfast, lunch and dinner. For clients looking to re-fuel but not miss any of the action the café offers expansive views of the Cadillac Mountain Range and is a great vantage point to watch the Radiator Springs Racers zoom by.



## Meet The Locals

Lightning McQueen and Mater usually make appearances and pose for photos near the Cozy Cone Motel in Cars Land—but above, they are pictured at Flo's V8 Café, which takes on a whole new look at night and features the neon of Route 66.

## Pixar Play Parade

The Popular Pixar Play Parade is returning to Disney California Adventure for the northern summer and will be performed twice-daily, featuring all the popular characters. New for 2012 is the Dancin' With Disney interactive character show. For show and parade times on specific dates, see Disneyland.com



## Do-se-do-ing Tractors

Mater's Junkyard Jamboree with its dancing tractors may sound like a gentler option, but riders sitting in the trailers are swung from one side of the 'dance floor' to another with lots of twists and spins performed to Mater's own hoedown songs. In fact, Disney calls it a 'tow-si-do!' It's a lot of fun and last night the ride got the big thumbs up from Larry The Cable Guy, the voice of Mater, although he admitted it was 'kinda weird' sitting on the ride listing to Mater (his character) talk to park guests.



## Luigi's Flying Tires

For something a little different, guests can help Luigi test-drive a new shipment of oversized tires. Riders are floating on air as they lean left and right to negotiate the way accompanied by giant beach balls and music. For many the ride is reminiscent of the Flying Saucers attraction.

## New In World of Color

World of Color, the watery nighttime spectacular at Disney California Adventure, will launch some new additions and surprises 'from TRON legacy to Prep & Landing', says Disney. This northern summer Merida (the animated star of new Disney-Pixar movie *Brave*) will debut in the show along with her faithful steed Angus.

## Minnie's Fly Girls

Visitors can sing along with Minnie Mouse in the Minnie's Fly Girls Charter Airline show. Staged at Condor Flats, near Soarin' Over California (in California Adventure) the travel-related sing-along features songs from the 40s, 50s and 60s—and also includes the chance to meet Minnie Mouse.
