Travel A Winner With A High NZD

Devaluing the New Zealand dollar may impact negatively on the travel industry but exporters are adamant more expensive holidays are a small price to pay in the long run.

New Zealand First and the New Zealand Manufacturers and Exporters Association (NZMEA) are among groups calling for the dollar to be devalued to as low as USD0.60, saying it is significantly overvalued and causing job losses.

The issue was debated in Parliament last week, when Finance Minister Bill English said that although the high dollar is a concern National doesn't agree it should be devalued as this would mean a drop in income and living standards for Kiwis.

Flight Centre New Zealand executive general manager Mike Friend agrees, urging the government not to forget the travel industry which is reaping the benefits of a favourable exchange rate.

"The stronger the dollar is, the better it is for outbound travel, which helps the travel industry in New Zealand and helps employ more people," he says.

"That should be taken into consideration if there's any sort of devaluing the dollar that will stop Kiwis travelling, which will hurt the travel industry. There's winners and losers, and when the dollar goes up the travel industry is a winner."

Stella Travel Services chief executive Greig Leighton echoes this sentiment—but maintains Kiwis will continue to travel, despite a lower exchange rate. "If the NZD is devalued in any shape or form it will have an impact. We've certainly seen stimulation of the US market because of the high USD exchange rate," says Leighton. "And with the stronger exchange rate people are spending more and opting for a slightly higher yielding product, like cruising, river cruising and escorted tours."

However Leighton adds that as proven in the past, even with a lower exchange rate, Kiwis will continue to travel overseas.

. . . More Than Holidays

The NZMEA and New Zealand First are forging ahead with campaigns for currency intervention—and cheaper holidays is no reason to keep things as they are, NZMEA chief John Walley said yesterday.

Certain things—including overseas holidays—will become more expensive in the short-term but exporters will earn more, help to balance the country's books and create more jobs, he says. "An overvalued currency might feel good for a while but cheap imports and offshore holidays don't help sustain an economy and really don't matter much when you don't have a job," he says.

Wotif Chief Resigns

Wotif chief executive and managing director Robbie Cooke has resigned today, and will leave the company at the end of the year after seven years leading the company. Cooke will 'pursue an opportunity outside of the travel industry' says Wotif chair Dick McIlwain. The Wotif board has commenced the search to appoint a new ceo.

Lady Liberty Reopening

The interior of the Statue of Liberty will reopen to the public on a limited basis on 28 Oct after a USD27 million renovation. The project, which includes a new lift, stairs and wheelchair lift, will be fully complete by year's end, says the US National Parks Service.

Top Travel Rip-offs

The cost of withdrawing cash from an overseas ATM is considered the biggest travel-related rip-off, followed closely by organised tours and excursions, hotel Wi-Fi, taxi fares and credit card charges, shows the latest UK Skyscanner poll. One in five of those surveyed say the cost of withdrawing cash abroad was the biggest rip-off, as they were often caught unawares by bank charges, while organised tours were considered overhyped and over-rated by 17% of those surveyed. Skyscanner says extra charges and hidden costs can catch out 'even the savviest jetsetter'.

A new industry training organisation (ITO) is to be formed following a Deed of Merger signed last week by the Aviation, Tourism and Travel Organisation (ATTTO), Hospitality Standards Institute (HSI) and Retail Institute. The Service Skills Institute is expected to commence 01 Jan 2013 but there will be a likely transition of several months, and the Deed of Merger is still subject to certain conditions. The merger is based on the view that 'it will enable the three ITOs to better protect and promote the interests of our industries', says HSI chief Ken Harris.





On Track For One Billion Tourists

International tourist numbers are 'firmly on track' to reach one billion by the end of the year as demand continues to show resilience in spite of economic concerns, says the UN World Tourism Organisation (UNWTO).

Numbers worldwide grew 5% or 22 million Jan-Jun 2012 compared to the same time last year, and Asia Pacific led the growth by region with an increase of 8%.

A slight slowdown is expected for the rest of the year but numbers are still forecast to exceed one billion for the first time, says UNWTO.

"Amid the current economic uncertainty, tourism is one of the few economic sectors in the world growing strongly, driving economic progress in developing and developed countries alike and, most importantly, creating


