Gurney Upbeat On Stella Operation

Visiting Jetset Travelworld Group chief executive Rob Gurney has given the company's Kiwi operation the big thumbs up during his inaugural visit to New Zealand in the role.

Gurney has spent three days this week going though the Stella Travel business and says over-

all he's 'genuinely very happy' with its performance, which is meeting expectations. "Both the parts [of the business] and the whole are doing very well," he added.

Speaking at a Stella supplier function in Auckland last night Gurney acknowledged the work of Stella chief executive Greig Leighton and the management team, adding that his visit was about 'listening and learning' rather than telling Leighton how to run the Kiwi business.

Gurney, who headed up British Airways in New Zealand in the mid-90s, says he has taken a lot of positives out of his visit which included meetings with the Stella management and some key industry partners.

... Looking Forward

Gurney has confirmed the Boston Consultancy Group review of the wider JTG business will include New Zealand. "It's a group review and does cover all aspects of our business,"



says Gurney. "Greig will be very engaged on that, and there are a number of dimensions to it. It will also look at if there are any learnings from the New Zealand business that we can take into Australia."

The new JTG boss says the review is very much a consultative process, evaluating the business in the

context of the market landscape, and will include meeting Stella's stakeholders such as its travel agency network partners (franchisees, the broker advisory council and independents) and supplier partners.

"It will put into perspective what the group's challenges and opportunities are, and then we will move through the process of defining a strategy to take the group through the next three to five years," says Gurney. See page 4 for pics.

BA: Committed To Oz

British Airways has refuted claims made in Australian media reports that it will consider pulling out of the Aussie market if the proposed Qantas/ Emirates tie-up is approved. BA says it's committed to Australia, and its oneworld partner QF.

TAAP Seasonal Changes

Expedia TAAP is reporting a shift in the destinations clients are booking, with Australia/New Zealand making up 27% and Asia 28% of all bookings last week. Latin America rose to 5%, while Europe and North America slipped to 19% and 21% respectively, says TAAP's Stuart Udy. "We are expecting a jump in long-haul bookings in relation to the early bird fares in the market," he says.

LON's New Theme Park

A GBP2 billion, 872 acre movie theme park, which would reportedly be one of the largest in the world and rival Disneyland Paris, is planned for London. Paramount Pictures has agreed to use its name for the park, set to open in 2018, which would also feature Europe's largest indoor water park, theatres, cinemas, restaurants, event space and hotels, say reports.

EK Fined AUD10m

Emirates has been ordered to pay AUD10 million in penalties for engaging in cartel conduct, becoming the tenth airline to settle in Australia's air freight price fixing case.

The Australian Competition and Consumer Commission alleges that a group of airlines fixed prices relating to fuel and other surcharges. So far AUD68 million in penalties have been ordered—the highest ever in an ACCC investigation. Proceedings are due to begin 22 Oct against NZ, SQ, CX and TG.

EK admitted to 'illegal understandings' related to a fuel surcharge, security surcharge and customs fee on air freight, and attempting to arrive at an understanding on rates charged for the supply of air freight services.

The carrier was ordered to pay \$1.5 million in New Zealand in Jul as a settlement in the Commerce Commission's air cargo price fixing case—the sixth airline to settle here.





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SQ Earlybirds

Singapore Airlines has released its earlybirds to UK/Europe, Asia, South Africa, Middle East and SilkAir destinations, and is offering extra baggage allowance, bonus KrisFlyer miles and a guarantee that the UK/Europe levels will be the lowest offered by SQ for travel 01 Feb-30 Nov (excluding M class). Economy fares ex AKL are from \$2617 to LON, \$2385 to IST and \$1622 to SIN, and ex CHC include \$2557 to LON, \$2336 to ROM and \$1648 to HKT. J class levels include from \$9099 to LON and \$8697 to ROM. Fares are valid for sales to 17 Dec. Clients will receive an extra 10kg baggage on SQ operated flights (or 5kg on SQ/MI flights), and can earn 25%-50% extra miles.

Air New Zealand has Seat + Bag fares ex WLG to BNE from \$244 for sales to 02 Nov and travel to 30 Sep 13.

DJ Questions QF/EK Partnership, Again

Virgin Australia has again urged the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission to consider whether Qantas' proposed tie-up with Emirates would have any public benefit.

DJ says in its submission that QF's moves to sever ties with Kangaroo Route carriers and fly its own metal through Dubai regardless of its application outcome, suggest 'the majority of the public benefits as set out in the submission... will be available absent the Proposed Conduct [partnership]'.

In addition, DJ claims QF's tactics are not those of an airline looking to pull out of its long-haul markets due to financial pressure. "Rather, they appear to be the decisions of a strong and vigorous competitor seeking to retain its position in the relevant markets." DJ adds both the scope and term

MH Immigration Fine

Malaysia Airlines was fined \$5500 in the Manukau District Court for not complying with a 'do not board' directive from Immigration New Zealand in Jan.

The offence related to a Malaysian national boarding a flight bound for Auckland from Kuala Lumpur. "In this case, on receiving the directive not to board the passenger, the check-in attendant entered an altered passport number, allowing our systems to be circumvented," says Immigration New Zealand gm Peter Elms. MH was prosecuted in Apr 2007 for similar offending.

QF/EK are seeking are too broad and 'not justified', noting the ACCC has been 'reluctant' to grant approval to alliances longer than five years. "Indeed, the ACCC granted authorisation to the DJ/Air New Zealand alliance for a three year period," it says.

New LH Terminal In FRA

The new Pier A-Plus terminal at Frankfurt Airport, which will be used exclusively by Lufthansa and its partners, has entered operation after almost four years of construction, LH says. The extension of Terminal 1 will lead to faster transfer times and less bus transfers to the terminal for passengers. LH also expanded its lounge space, with five now available across the airport, including First Class, Senator and Business lounges in EU departures/arrivals, plus a Senator and Business lounge in the 'Non-Schengen' zone of FRA.

New NOU Accomm Deals

Some New Caledonia hoteliers have released new specials which can be combined with Aircalin's new IT wholesale levels, released this week. Ramada Plaza has new off-peak rates

for travel to 31 Mar which are a 'substantial discount' on contract rates, says Hogan and Associates. Parisienne breakfast is also included.

Royal Tera Beach Resort has a stay four, pay three and stay seven, pay five deal, while Oure Tera Beach Resort has stay three pay two, for sales to 31 Oct and travel through to 30 Jun (blackouts apply). Wholesalers have details for both deals.

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HLZ Chief Steps Down

H a m i l t o n Airport chief executive Chris Doak is leaving the company next Jan after seven years during which he oversaw the completion of



several major projects, says HLZ chairman John Birch.

Doak oversaw a \$15.3 million terminal upgrade, the formation of Hamilton Waikato Tourism and the commencement of Pacific Blue's international services, amongst other milestones, says Birch. He is now looking to take 'the next step in his career'.

The airport will not appoint a new ceo following Doak's departure—two senior managers will instead take on the extra responsibility.

Aussie Domestic Air Stoush Continues

News & Product

The battle between Qantas and Virgin Australia for dominance in the domestic Australian market continues, with QF still leading in the capacity and passenger number stakes in Aug, while DJ edges QF out in terms of revenue passenger kilometre growth.

In Aug, QF grew the number of Australian domestic passengers (including QF Link) by 0.3% to 1.928 million, while DJ grew 2.3% to 1.435

million. Meanwhile DJ's RPKs increased 3.7% to 1.654 million against 1.3% growth to 2.487 million for QE DJ is putting the RPK increase down to the introduction of longer sectors and growth in passengers on transcontinental flights. QF (including Jetstar) is reporting lower total domestic yields and lower loads against Aug 11 due to increased capacity on domestic routes and the prior period impact of Tiger Airways' grounding.
