### **White Island Warning**

The aviation colour code and Volcanic alert level for White Island has been upgraded following changes in the 'style' of seismic activity. The Volcanic Alert level has is now at level 1, which indicates signs of volcanic unrest, and the Aviation Colour Code has been changed from yellow to orange as of yesterday, says GNS Science. Volcanologists say visitors to the island are now at the highest level of risk since the start of the 2012 eruptions, and eruptions are possible with little or no warning.

### **World's Biggest Airport**

The world's largest airport by passenger numbers is reportedly being planned for Istanbul. The six-runway airport would be able to handle 150 million passengers a year, with the first stage operational in 2017.

### TAS Marketing Shake-up

Tourism Tasmania is withdrawing its in-market representation from New Zealand at the end of Feb after a 'thorough' review of its international marketing program. The STO will now instead focus on cooperative marketing activities with Tourism Australia. "The aim is to better capitalise on Tourism Australia's multi-million dollar investment in international marketing through programmes like their visiting journalist programme, in-market campaigns, and their digital and PR activities," it says in an overview of the changes on its website. There will also be increased support for 'industry-led international sales and marketing programs', it adds. The new approach to marketing will also focus on attracting internationals already living in Australia, and the VFR market that stems from them. Tourism Tasmania chief executive John Fitzgerald was unavailable for comment by press time today.

### **Top Gear Fest Details**

The official schedule for the inaugural Top Gear Festival Sydney (09-10 Mar) was released yesterday, with plenty of petrol-headed action headed up Jeremy Clarkson, James May and The Stig.

The Red Bull Racing Formula One team will square off against V8 Supercars champions in a F1 Vs V8 competition; Clarkson will challenge various forms of transport; May will attempt to speed up the Express Postal service; and the Stig will race some of the world's rarest supercars. A world-renowned athlete will take on Clarkson in a 100m race; there's a race between a car and a plane; and three celebrity teams will battle it out in a tri-nations cup (Australia, New Zealand and the rest of the world).

### **NZ Sustainable Award**

Air New Zealand has been named a finalist in the 2013 Tourism for Tomorrow Awards recognising sustainable tourism best practice.

The carrier says it aims to become the world's most environmentally sustainable airline and has worked hard to achieve this goal, including enhancing fuel efficiency, partnering with the Department of Conservation and supporting green projects around the country through its environment trust.

### **EY Unveils New B777**

### IATA Runway Safety Plan

IATA is working with aviation stakeholders to reduce runway excursions in Europe—one of the most common types of air accidents.

In 2011, 13% of all accidents in European airspace were runway excursions, and globally they accounted for 19% of all accidents.

IATA has joined 16 other stakeholders to develop a European Action Plan for the Prevention of Runway Excursions. They aim to tackle the issue through providing operational and system recommendations to aircraft operators, air navigation service providers, airports and regulatory authorities.

Qantas says it does not expect there to be compulsory redundancies resulting from the loss of a check-in and ground handling contract with Air New Zealand. "Air New Zealand advised Qantas in Nov that they would not be renewing their contract for ground handling services when the current contract expires in Mar," says QF. "We are currently looking at what impact this will have on our employees." The Australian Services Union is said to be meeting with QF management tomorrow, and it too does not expect compulsory job losses.

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
