Southern Barrier Reef's Kiwi Growth

Queensland's Southern Great Barrier Reef (SGBR) plans to continue working with the local trade in promoting the region on the back of a boost in visitor numbers and room nights from New Zealand.

RTOs in the region banded together a few years ago to market themselves as the SGBR, and first visited New Zealand in late 2011 looking to increase their profile here.

Trade famils and expo presence followed, and the most recent statistics for the region show a 27% increase in Kiwi visitors for the year to Sep 2012, reaching 19,000. Visitor nights grew 40% to 268,000 in the same period.

SGBR is excited by the success so far and plans to continue capitalising

Fiji Wedding Famil

"SGBR is continuing to focus their international marketing efforts on the New Zealand market and these most recent stats have not only shown great increases in visitation, but New Zealand is now the second largest international market to this region," she says.

SGBR representatives and operators will return to New Zealand next month for workshops and presentations on the region. There are events on in Auckland on 21 May and Christchurch 22 May, see industry diary for details.

... Kiwi Favourites

The SGBR region encompasses Bundaberg, Gladstone and Rockhampton. For Kiwis, the most popular activities so far include visiting Lady Elliot Island and Heron Island, where visitors can snorkel or dive with manta rays and sea turtles; exploring the coastal towns and villages of Bargara, Agnes Water and Town of 1770, Yeppoon and Emu Park; caving in the Capricorn Caves; fossicking for sapphires; and watching turtles lay eggs or seeing the babies hatch in turtle season Nov-Mar.

New US Route For NZ?

There are industry rumours Air New Zealand may be set to announce services on a North American route in the not-too-distant future.

The carrier has declined to comment on the matter, however *Travel Today* understands NZ is evaluating the merits of a new service to an as yet unnamed US destination.

NZ boss Christoper Luxon said in late Feb that the carrier was leasing two 777-300 aircraft, due for delivery mid-2014. At the time Luxon said the carrier would look where to best deploy the aircraft, and that NZ was looking at a range of markets, and whether to add capacity or commence new routes. NZ is also due to take delivery of its first 787-9 mid-2014.

Weight Fares Fair

Following the palaver over Air Samoa's move to calculate passengers' fares by their body weight, the majority of respondents to a *Travel Today* poll said the scheme was fair. In the poll, 70% of respondents said the move was fair, while 30% disagreed. European low cost carriers such as Ryanair had joked about introducing a weight-based fare structure in the past, but it was the little Samoan carrier that became the first to actually go ahead with it.

Accident Cause Probed

Authorities are investigating why a virtually new B737 operated by Lion Air undershot the runway and crashed into the water near Bali's Ngurah Rai airport on the weekend. All 108 passengers onboard survived, with some treated in local hospitals for minor injuries. Wind shear has been cited as a possible cause for the incident, according to *AP*.

IATA Responds To WTAAA Concerns

The World Travel Agents Association Alliance has raised concerns with IATA about its New Distribution Capability project in relation to airfare competition and the potential cost to agents and consumers to switch to the NDC. Following its bi-annual board meeting, the WTAAA welcomed open dialogue between itself and IATA on the NDC, and says it has shared its con-

cerns with the global airline body which focus on three 'major' issues. The WTAAA says the NDC appears to

eliminate or reduce consumers' ability to neutrally compare fare prices, which promotes competition between carriers, and that implementing the NDC would 'impose huge costs directly on to travel agencies' as systems and processes would need to be redesigned to accommodate the programme.

It also claimed that NDC required consumers' personal data to obtain a fare quote—raising privacy concerns.

IATA has responded to the WTAAA's concerns, saying consumers do not have the ability to carry out neutral comparison shopping through indirect channels, as some carriers choose

"NDC will enable full price transparency on complete airline offers as well as on the base fare. Rather than competing only on base fares, NDC will result in airlines competing vigorously across the spectrum of products and services, something that can only make the overall travel experience more rewarding," says IATA.

IATA has acknowledged that the cost to switch to NDC will vary between various industry stakeholders that choose to adopt the new standard but adds that the upcoming NDC pilot programs will be designed 'in part to identify the costs associated with modernising indirect distributions'. It adds that clients will not have to provide personal details beyond the current norm for adult or child (or active military in the US) to receive a quote.

Avis In NZ's Great Race

It looks like the agents who win a place on Air New Zealand's Great Race Hawaii will need to perfect the art of driving on the 'wrong' side of the road. The carrier told agents at the Harvey World Travel conference in Waikiki over the weekend that Avis was a platinum sponsor for this year's event. A far cry from the police escorts and chauffeurs which featured in last year's race, the selfdrive aspect could add a whole new dimension to this year's race! Agents, remember the sales incentive for the Battle of the Brands, to determine the final three teams which will compete in Hawaii, ends 18 Apr.

Akaroa Marine Reserve

The Akaroa Harbour around Dan Rogers Bluff is New Zealand's newest marine reserve, says Conservation Minister Nick Smith. Opposition from Ng i Tahu and hobby fishers saw the northern boundary move, reducing the reserve to 475ha. "Akaroa is an iconic harbour that is hugely popular for recreation and tourism but its marine life is degraded," says Smith. "[The reserve] will enhance the area, assist scientific study and benefit the public." The Akaroa Harbour Marine Protection Society first applied for the reserve in Jan 1996.

CZ On CHC, WLG

Following reports last week that China Southern may be launching flights to Christchurch and Wellington, the carrier has confirmed it is looking at opportunities but won't say what they are yet.

Christchurch Airport head Jim Boult said from China last week that CZ is planning to include CHC in its route plans, and media reports suggested WLG would also see CZ flights.

"China Southern continuously explores opportunities beyond its current ports in Australia and New Zealand," a CZ spokesperson told *Travel Today*, adding that the ports 'will include other major cities and regional destinations' but that they can't be more specific at this stage.

No Local Brunei Rep
