South America Heats Up; New Brand

Kiwis travelling to South America could benefit from a pricing war similar to that seen on the Auckland-Honolulu route, say sources, as demand heats up and a new independent brand dedicated to the destination launches here.

The industry is reporting increased interest in the South American region, thanks in part to Air New Zealand's new Buenos Aires flights launching at the end of this year.

House of Travel's Brent Thomas says Kiwis are looking for unique destinations and the launch of NZ's flights is likely to lead to market growth for the region as a whole, 'not just people moving from one carrier to another'. "What we do know is when we get

a new route or one where there is a significant increase in capacity with a new airline we will see significant market growth," he says.

The effect could be similar to that of Hawaiian Airlines launching on HNL-AKL, which led to some 'fantastic pricing', he says. "What we expect is that pricing will remain competitive [to South America]."

United Travel's John Willson says they too are seeing more clients interested in the destination, although with NZ's flights not yet on sale they're still waiting to see if the interest will translate to bookings. "To me this is a new tourist destination opening up—the interest is certainly there."

... New Travel Brand

The growth in demand from Kiwis to Latin America meanwhile has led local operator Viva Expeditions to expand its offering, with the launch in New Zealand of Chimu Adventures.

"In the last couple of years we have experienced huge growth," says Viva's Rachel Williams, who's picking Latin America as 'the' destination of 2016. "It is a huge continent with so much to see and do, we want to make it easy for agents. It is a high yield destination that is really expanding and with NZ set to start flying at the end of this year demand is only expected to increase," she says.

Viva has teamed up with Chimu in Australia to meet the growing demand. For more details see p5.

NZ/CA To Fly BJS-AKL

Air New Zealand and Air China have released details of their proposed alliance on services between China and New Zealand. The alliance, subject to regulatory approvals, would see CA introduce a daily direct service between Beijing and Auckland, as well as continuing to codeshare on NZ's daily Shanghai - Auckland service which will operate exclusively by 787-9 from late Aug. Subject to approval, services could commence as early as Dec 2015. NZ boss Christopher Luxon says the alliance will see 'two home carriers with complementary strengths at each end of the route working together to drive traffic in both directions'.

NZ Night Rider To WL

Auckland has confirmed Auckland-Wellington is the next route for its Night Rider services. From 17 Apr-14 May, Thu-Mon, an extra A320 late night service will operate with every seat priced from \$39 Seat + Bag.

Yellow Fever Update

Adventure World has advised that a yellow fever vaccination certificate is no longer required when travelling from Zambia into Botswana. This comes after the South African Department of Health confirmed last month it no longer requires travellers from Zambia to produce a yellow fever certificate when entering the country. It follows on the World Health Organisation's confirmation in Jan of low yellow fever exposure status for Zambia.

EK Fare Changes; YQ Phasing Out

Emirates will be revising its long-term Economy Class fare structure with effect from 31 Mar.

Existing bookings will need to be ticketed by 30 Mar to avail of current long-term fares. Further details and tariffs will be distributed in due course and the GDS will be updated on 31 Mar.

Along with this, EK is in the process of phasing out YQ fuel surcharges

BNZ Backlash

Some in the industry are questioning if Kiwi travellers may change banks, after it was announced last week Air New Zealand Airpoints will no longer be available through BNZ GlobalPlus from May. At this time they will instead become available with Westpac. BNZ is urging its clients not to 'let an airline dictate your bank', and says customers don't want to be tied to one airline or type of reward but would rather earn cash.

However one industry source says BNZ has 'completely missed the point' and GlobalPlus users are more interested in gaining status points to boost their membership level.

There will be no change to the Business and First Class long-term fares currently and YQ will remain in place for Business and First Class until further notice.

Qantas will be providing additional capacity to Dallas/Fort Worth and Hong Kong during the holiday season. QF currently operates six flights per week between Sydney and Dallas/Fort Worth, however, they will increase to daily A380 services from 08 Dec to 19 Jan. QF will also upgrade its service between Sydney and Hong Kong from 10 Dec to 20 Jan, replacing its B747 services with an A380 aircraft on Mon, Thu, Fri, Sat and Sun. From 21 Jan-16 Feb, QF will operate the A380 daily on this route.

Capacity Up For Carnival In The US

Carnival Triumph will replace Carnival Elation on the four- and five-day short cruise program ex-New Orleans in the Northern spring, which will increase Carnival's capacity by 34% on this route, says the cruise company.

The released Carnival Elation will reposition to Jacksonville, Fla., for year-round four-and five-day cruises freeing up Carnival Fascination for a shift to San Juan for year-round seven-day Caribbean cruises beginning in spring 2016, providing consumers with 'fresh and exciting' new choices in these markets. As previously announced, Carnival Liberty will replace Carnival Triumph on the line's year-round four-and five-day cruise program from Galveston next spring.

More Visas On Arrival Boost Tourism

The implementation of visa-onarrival policies in particular has led to strong visa facilitation progress in recent years, which reflects well on the increased awareness among policymakers of the positive impacts of visa facilitation on tourism and economic growth, says UNWTO.

The bureau's latest Visa Openness Report shows 62% of the world's population required a traditional visa prior to departure in 2014, down from 77% in 2008. In the same year, 19% of the world's population was able to enter a destination without a visa, while 16% could receive a visa on arrival, as compared to 17% and 6% in 2008.

The report also shows that the most prevalent facilitation measure implemented has been 'visa on arrival'. Over half of all improvements made in the last four years were from 'visa required' to 'visa on arrival'.

Countries in the Americas and in Asia and the Pacific have been at the fore-front of visa facilitation, while Europe and Middle East have more restrictive visa policies. Overall, emerging economies tend to be more open than advanced ones, with South-East Asia, East Africa, the Caribbean and Oceania among the most open sub-regions.

Research by UNWTO and the World Travel and Tourism Council (WTTC) shows that the G20 economies could boost their international tourist numbers by an additional 122 million, generate an extra USD206 billion in tourism exports and create over five million additional jobs by improving visa processes and entry formalities. The same research carried out for the APEC and the ASEAN countries indicates that visa facilitation could generate important gains for both groups, including the creation of 2.6 million jobs in APEC and 650,000 jobs in ASEAN.



The Isle of Harris Distillery in Tarbert will be the first distillery in Harris when it opens this spring. It will be a Social Distillery that gives its guests a warm welcome with personal guided tours and the reportedly rare opportunity to find how the first Harris whisky will be made. Local produce will be on offer in its canteen and retail area.

The re-opening of Annandale Distillery after 90 years means that fine Single Malt Scotch whisky will be available again from Dumfries & Galloway. A variety of tours will show visitors the processes of whisky making and the distillery manager will be on hand to answer any questions. A coffee shop and retail area will be on site.

Glengoyne Distillery (Glasgow) is extending its tour offering with the opening of a new maturation area and warehouse, No1 Warehouse. Owned by the Wemyss family, The Kingsbarns Distillery and Visitor Centre is located just outside of St Andrews in the village of Kingsbarns. The first Kingsbarns Single Malt Scotch whisky will be ready in 2018 and the visitor centre will offer a unique opportunity for guests to watch the process first-hand and be part of the history of the Kingsbarns Single Scotch Malt Whisky in the making.


The agents have finished their US mainland tours and have two days in Hawaii before they head home.
