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Asia Cruise Boom Is New Zealand's Gain

Kiwi cruisers are set to benefit from a boom in cruising in Asia, with the region seeing 'robust' double-digit growth, according to CLIA's new 2014 Asia Cruise Trends study.

Historic numbers are being recorded in Asia, with double-digit annual growth over the past two years across all areas including the number of ships, sailings, operating days and passenger capacity, says CLIA.

"With cruise lines hosting nearly 1.4 million Asian guests last year, a 34% increase in just two years, the global cruise industry has recognised that Asia is quickly becoming a major international market in its own right," says CLIA Southeast Asia chair Ann Sherry.

The increase in guests from Asia in turn means Kiwi cruisers can expect to see more ships and more capacity heading to Australasia, as well as associated improvements in infrastructure to cater to them, says CLIA Australasia general manager Brett Jardine.

"We welcome the continued increase in deployments in the Asian

region and the potential opportunities this provides for the Australasian market, both in terms of seasonal deployments and as a source market," says Jardine.

"With more ships based in the region, Australia and New Zealand will likely see a greater number of ships as well as larger capacity ships, which would require infrastructure investment to take advantage of the growth opportunities."

As the cruise industry in Asia develops, there's also likely to be an increase in Kiwis heading on a cruise in the region.

"We're confident that we will see growth in the number of Kiwis cruising in Asian waters and taking advantage of the chance to visit multiple exotic destinations and cultures during one magnificent voyage," says Jardine.

. . . Key Figures

Key findings of the CLIA report for the Asian region include: passenger capacity is expected to reach almost 2.2 million this year; 52 cruise ships will operate in the region, a 10% compound annual growth rate since 2013; the number of cruises and longer voyages in the region has grown 11% a year to 1065 sailings for 2015; and the number of days cruise ships are in operation has grown from 4307 in 2013 to 5824 in 2015.

Mile High Apps

An app to allow travellers to hook up mid-air, cheaper flights for 'mucking in' at the airport and flying coaches were among the April Fools jokes released by travel companies today.

Student Flights promised its new mile high app would allow travellers to 'hook up' in the skies by logging in on the plane's Wi-Fi and matching with their fellow passengers. "For single passengers especially this is going to make travelling solo a lot more fun—no more worrying about being bored for the next 12 hours," said New Zealand brand leader Sean Berenson. Cheapflights said travellers could save up to \$400 on selected routes for helping with odd jobs like loading their own luggage, leading safety demonstrations and cleaning the toilets.

AAT Kings meanwhile launched its 'revolutionary' new CoachCopter and HoverCoach products, set to fly over the Blue Mountains and hover on Sydney roads from later this year.

Rail Plus and Eurostar are giving New Zealand travel agencies the chance to win \$1000 worth of Countdown or Farmers gift cards every time a team member books and tickets a Eurostar sector between 01 Apr-31 May.

NZ 787 AKL-SIN?

Air New Zealand will begin operating a Dreamliner on the Auckland-Singapore route from 16 Nov, according to the GDS. The 787-9 will replace the B777-200ER and will operate on a daily basis.





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KLM's New Aircraft

KLM Cityhopper is renewing its fleet by purchasing fifteen Embraer 175 aircraft (E175+) and two Embraer 190 aircraft (E190).

KLM Cityhopper will welcome the two E190s in Dec, while the E175+ aircraft will enter the fleet between Mar 2016 and Jun 2018. Arrival of the new Embraers will be coupled with phasing out 19 Fokker 70s from service. The new aircraft will increase seat capacity and fuel efficiency.

ASR Rule Change

Korean Air's Advance Seat Request rule has changed. ASR now can be done up to 361 days, previously 90 days, before flight departure and until 48 hours before flight departure. Eligibility is for ticketed Economy Class passengers and both ticketed and reservation first/business class passengers.

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BNE Trialling Digital Dep. Card

Brisbane Airport is trialling a Digital Departure Card for international passengers, removing the age old necessity of hand writing the official 'outgoing passenger card' required for immigration purposes.

The new Digital Departure Card is built within the scope of the airport's mobile app, giving passengers the ability to enter and save personal information onto their mobile device prior to their arrival at the airport.

FJ Kids Deal

FJ airways advises agents the current wholesale levels, with special kids pricing, has been extended for sales till 09 Apr. Wholesalers have details.

Egypt Visa Changes

New changes to visa requirements for Egypt-bound New Zealanders mean that all tourists arriving in Egypt from 15 May will need to have obtained a visa prior to departure, advises Innovative Travel. For details, ph 0508 100 111

Bali Immigration Change

Effective 01 Apr, foreign visitors to Bali will reportedly no longer have to complete arrival and departure cards as part of the immigration process. The change is part of larger efforts to simplify and enhance services to foreign visitors through better technology, reports BaliDiscovery.

An electronic data gathering and monitoring system has also been introduced at Ngurah Rai International Airport, and will be used to track foreigners in Bali, says BaliDiscovery. It is currently being tested and when in full operation, will allow accommodation providers and the public to report details of foreign visitors (such as name and location) on-line. It's reportedly hoped that the public will 'participate in controlling the activities of foreigners in Bali'.

The information is then converted into a QR code that is scanned and printed at bespoke kiosks located in the International Terminal.

The personalised and printed card is then signed by the passenger and collected by Customs officers during the normal departure process. If the information is saved on the app, passengers will not have to complete their personal information when next travelling internationally from BNE. The Digital Departure Card was developed after Queensland University of Technology Interactive and Visual Design students came up with the idea as part of a practical assessment.

NZ: Air Auckland?

Transport Minister Simon Bridges has hinted at new international flights into Christchurch as Air New Zealand faces a backlash down south, where it's reportedly being dubbed 'Air Auckland'.

Christchurch Labour MPs say they have secured a meeting in mid-Apr with NZ boss Christopher Luxon, following their disappointment over the carrier's call to axe its Christchurch to Tokyo Narita summer flights. NZ will no longer operate any long-haul flights from CHC once the flights stop. Bridges, who has been sticking up for NZ, told media 'from everything I know there is only going to be more air services from more airlines in the next year or two', including to both AKL and CHC. However CHC Airport said it's not aware at this stage of any new services launching.

Better Air Links With 10 New ASAs

The New Zealand Government has announced 10 new and amended air services agreements with Bahrain, Colombia, Egypt, Greece, Oman, Serbia and the Seychelles, which it says will give Kiwis greater options for travelling to those countries.

It has also confirmed arrangements reached with the Czech Republic and Curaçao to provide opportunities for airlines to offer code-share services.

"The new arrangements mean that airlines from these countries will

"Similarly, New Zealand airlines now have the opportunity to offer services in these markets."

An amendment to an agreement with China announced last Nov has also been confirmed, doubling the number of services airlines can operate between China and New Zealand.

"The amendment provides immediate opportunities for continued growth in air services between New Zealand and China following an increase in weekly services from three to 21 in the last four years," says Bridges.

... Middle East

The new agreements with Bahrain and Oman mean New Zealand now has air service agreements with all members of the Gulf Cooperation Council, removing any barriers for Gulf carriers looking to fly here and paving the way for stronger links with the Middle East, says Bridges.

The 10 new agreements were negotiated by Ministry of Transport officials at the International Civil Aviation Negotiation Conference in Indonesia in Nov.

"The government will continue to seek opportunities to open and expand new and existing air links with other countries," says Bridges.

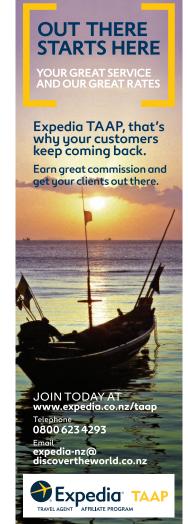
New At Sabre

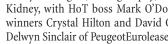

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Paris Parking Increase

A new parking fee system in Paris, effective 01 May, will see the price of half-day and full-day parking passes increase for motor coaches which do not meet the latest EU emission standards for trucks and buses, known as Euro 6. Reports say a number of tour operator associations are protesting the new system, with claims it places an unfair financial burden on their members and was adopted without sufficient lead time. Contiki Holidays says although it operates a modern coach fleet, with the majority featuring the latest Euro 6 technology, the changes will result in significantly higher costs going forward.

"Contiki Holidays will absorb these costs for the current season as they were not factored into 2015 prices in Aug last year and we are not intending surcharging our travellers for them," it says. 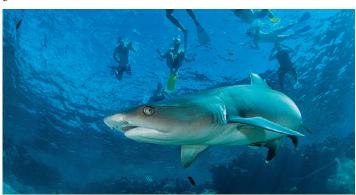
Australia's Top 10
