New Zealand residents departed on a total of 2.34 million overseas trips in the year ended Jun 2015 while Jun travel realised continued growth, show the latest Statistics New Zealand figures.

Kiwis took 220,800 overseas trips for

the month under review—the second highest Jun total since the record 221,100 trips in Jun 2012, when the mid-year school holidays started earlier, notes Statistics New Zealand.

Jun travel, year-on-year, was up 7% (or 14,200 trips). Travel by country of main destination continued to be dominated by Australia, the US and Fiji.

Jun Kiwi travel to Australia was up 8300 trips year-on-year to 89,380; to the US up 1600 trips to 18,440; and to Fiji, up 1500 to 14,860 trips.

Other notable growth included a 21.5% spike in Jun Kiwi travel to Thailand; and up 25% to Taiwan (albeit off a small base). Jun travel to Japan was up 22.8%, to China, up 9% (to 6520 trips) and to the Cooks up 10.2% (to 8660 trips).

Some South Pacific destinations showed a drop in year-on-year figures, with Kiwi Jun travel to Vanuatu down 34%; to New Caledonia, down 32.7% and to French Polynesia, down 7.5%.

... The Jun Year

Departures for the year to Jun 2015 year, reached 2.43 million trips—up 98,700 trips, or 4%, compared with the Jun 2014 year. Around half of all trips by Kiwi residents were to Australia (1.11 million), an increase of 46,600 from the Jun 2014 year. Residents also took more trips to the US (up 20,600), Fiji (up 15,800) and Indonesia (up 10,100).

US-Cuba Milestone

Yesterday marked the opening of the US Embassy in Havana and the Cuban Embassy in Washington, after 54 years; and it has been welcomed by American Airlines and United Airlines. AA chief executive Doug Parker says this is 'an important step toward building new commercial relationships and re-establishing scheduled air service between the US and Cuba'. "AA has operated charter flights to Cuba for nearly 25 years and we stand ready to begin scheduled service when it's allowed." Of the 'historic reopening' of the embassies, UA says it looks forward to 'continuing our constructive dialogue with both governments about providing our customers service between our two nations, subject to government approval'.

USTA: Competition Needed On US Routes

The US Travel Association is blasting reports that US carriers are planning to slow capacity growth over the coming summer, when travellers would already 'almost rather have a root canal than fly commercial'.

"It's depressing that actions that show disdain for travellers are the ones deemed to be the best business practices," says USTA boss Roger Dow. "The real irony is that American [Airlines] says it's cutting seats because of softening demand—which we've been worried was inevitable all along because surveys show US travellers would almost rather have a root canal than fly commercial."

Dow blames inaction from the government, saying major carriers are 'allowed to dominate routes and individual markets, keeping competitors out and enabling them to set prices with little or no downward pressure'.

APX chief executive Andrew Dale, says partnering with Amadeus will support the growth of the TMC and will enable it 'to take its customer experience to new heights', through a customised technology platform. "With Amadeus technology, our customers will experience improved efficiencies, a greater focus on online and mobile capability, greater automation and a more robust solution for managing duty-of-care responsibilities for business travel," says Dale.

Low Water Impacts Euro River Cruises

Low water levels on a number of European rivers have caused multiple cruise lines to cancel or adjust their itineraries, whilst others are closely monitoring the situation.

Globus family of brands' Troy Ackerman says Avalon Waterways' operations team in Europe are continually monitoring the situation.

In a statement on its Facebook page today, Avalon Waterways says due to the low water levels between Regensburg and Passau, Avalon Vista and Avalon Impression are currently operating under contingency plans. However, Avalon Expression, who arrived in the region today, was able to traverse the low waters. It also says

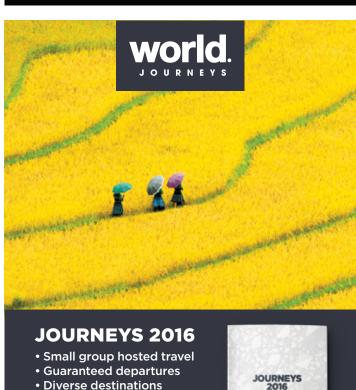
