IRTN Growth Outpaces Average

Stella's Independent Retail Travel Network (IRTN) brand is going from strength to strength, as the group reports continued growth in terms of members and its level of sales.

There are now some 90 IRTN agencies across the country, and the group's BSP growth is 'well outpacing the industry average' says IRTN general manager Rob Beecher.

Beecher attributes the continued growth of the group to the fact that its operating model is meeting the need of agencies who specialise in VFR travel as well as appealing to a growing number of 'traditional' Kiwi travel agencies.

"It's an eclectic group of agents—but it's proving successful for the agencies and we are seeing some pretty



significant increases in sales," adds Beecher.

IRTN recently held its first conference, and plans are already underway for next year's 'bigger and better' event, says Beecher.

The conference focused on adapting to change and moving forward, 'because these days if you're not growing and changing you're not going to be around for much longer', quips Beecher.

Supplier feedback from the event was positive, with some noting that IRTN was increasingly becoming a major player in the local retail travel landscape.

More Meth Seized

Customs made 1660 drug seizures at the border in the first half of this year, 252 of which were methamphetamine-related, says Customs Minister Nicky Wagner.

"The methamphetamine seized at the border over six months would have a street value of up to \$141 million. The 369kg of precursors seized could have produced another \$105 million of methamphetamine," says Wagner.

The remaining 1408 seizures consisted of smaller quantities of a range of drugs including class c analogues, cannabis, ecstasy and controlled and prescription medicines that were found mainly through mail or air cargo.

Murder Tours Canned

A company criticised for conducting tours of a New South Wales forest where a serial killer buried his victims, has cancelled the tours, say reports. The NSW Government and victim support groups had condemned the tours, however, initially the company defended the tours, saying they were run with respect. After receiving hate mail, as well as 'poignant and thoughtful' emails about why the tours should be cancelled, the company changed their stance and indeed cancelled the tours.

JO's Latest OTP

Jetstar has released on-time performance statistics for the first two weeks of Jul, showing 85% of all domestic flights departed on-time. For peak-time flights, OTP was at 92% for AKL-CHC, 84% for AKL-WLG and 89% WLG-CHC. The carrier operated 98.6% of all scheduled domestic flights.

AKL Traffic Up In Jun

International passenger numbers (excluding transits) at Auckland Airport were up 7.2% in Jun compared to the month before, with particularly strong growth on US routes (up 15.4%), says the airport.

"Growth in international passenger volumes was underpinned by robust demand across all regions, with passenger loadings increasing across the network," says the airport.

The airport also saw strong growth in passenger volumes for the year-ending 30 Jun, with international passenger numbers up 5.7% on the year before; transit passengers up 6.7%; and domestic passengers up 4.2%.



Fiji Airways has released Fiji fares ex AKL, WLG or CHC to Fiji from \$679, return, for sales to 27 Jul and differing travel dates. Child levels are from \$399 return. Bookings are in N class, see the GDS for details.

Thai Aviation Deadline

Thailand has reportedly been given 65 days by the US Federal Aviation Administration to sort out aviation safety standard short-comings—or face a ban on launching flights to the US.

The FAA has wrapped up a five-day inspection of Thailand's Department of Civil Aviation, which followed the International Civil Aviation Organisation (ICAO) red-flagging the country on 18 Jun after the DCA failed to meet a 90-day deadline to correct shortcomings the ICAO had identified earlier, the Bangkok Post reports. Concerns include a shortage of qualified staff to carry out inspections, and not enough follow-ups. The DCA has said it will step up efforts to address concerns.

"We continue to monitor the situation closely. The safety of our guests and crew is our highest priority and we will keep customers updated as new information becomes available," says VA.

The carrier has waive all fare differences for guests booked to travel to Denpasar by 28 Jul, who now want to switch to one of 12 other island and coastal on VA's network.

Greek Banks Open, Restrictions Remain

Greek banks re-opened on 20 Jul, although some banking services remain limited, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade has advised.

New Zealanders in Greece should be aware of the continuing possibility that retail banking services throughout the country, including access to cash from ATMs and credit card payments, may become limited at short notice. Cash withdrawals using cards issued by Greek banks are limited to EUR420 per week, but travellers can currently continue to withdraw cash using a card issued by a non-Greek bank as normal, up to the daily limit imposed by the Greek banking system (usually EUR600) or by their card issuer. The credit card payment system continues to function and daily ATM withdrawal limits do not apply to foreign credit cards.

MFAT however recommends Kiwis have multiple means of payment with them (including cash, debit

Eurostar says its new fleet of e320 trains, with increased seat capacity, is now in the final stage of testing and on schedule to be launched at the end of the year. CX Jun Traffic, 'Healthy Rise'

Cathay Pacific Airways has released combined Cathay Pacific and Dragonair traffic figures for Jun that show a healthy rise in the number of passengers carried compared to the same month in 2014, but only a marginal increase in the volume of cargo and mail uplifted. Cathay Pacific general manger revenue management Patricia Hwang says the last week of Jun was particularly busy 'as we moved into the summer peak period, with strong demand for both long-haul and regional travel'. "Our new routes to Zurich and Boston have both been performing ahead of expectations. However, we saw a sharp falloff in bookings for Korea after the Hong Kong SAR Government raised the Red Outbound Travel Alert in response to the MERS outbreak," she says."Premium demand remained behind target on a number of key longhaul routes through we saw growth within the region."

A total of 2,810,592 passengers were carried in Jun, and increase of 7.6% from Jun 2014. The passenger load factor grew by 1.3 percentage points to 87.2% while capacity, measured in

available seat kilometres increased by 6.1%.

The two airlines carried 141,136 tonnes of cargo and mail last month, an increase of 0.5% compared to Jun 2014. The cargo and mail load factor fell by 2.2 percentage points to 62.7%.


