New One-Step SmartGates Coming

Leaving and arriving into New Zealand will soon become a one-step process for e-passport holders with the introduction of 29 next-generation SmartGates.

More than \$6 million from the Future Investment Fund will go towards expanding and modernising SmartGate at the borders, Customs Minister Nicky Wagner announced this morning. This includes an extra 29 next-generation SmartGates, which use biometric technology to make the process

quicker and easier for passengers. Passengers will no longer have to scan their passport at a kiosk and receive a ticket before heading to the gate. Instead, they'll scan their passport in a reader at the gate, then look into a camera. If the image matches the one on their passport, they'll be allowed through.

Nine new SmartGates will be installed this year, with the remaining 20 to be installed over the next 18 to 24 months.

"Expanding the automated border processing capacity at Auckland, Wellington, and Christchurch airports will enable Customs to manage the forecast growth in traveller volumes, which is expected to increase by around 2.3 million by 2019," says Wagner.

The accuracy of biometrics allows Customs to focus on 'managing security risks at the border as well as ensuring that legitimate travellers are cleared in a fast and seamless way', she says.

"Last year, 10.4 million air passengers crossed our border; and 96.4% were processed within 45 minutes, which is well above global ICAO standard of 90%," Wagner says. "The World Economic Forum ranks New Zealand sixth in the world for efficiency of the border, and the investment in new SmartGates will help further enhance our standing on the world stage."

TA Looks To OTAs

Tourism Australia has signed a three-year, multi-million dollar deal with Expedia—its first formal agreement with a global on-line travel agency. The partnership is aimed at developing campaigns and content to drive international travel to Australia, and was a deliberate move to focus on strategic partnerships which increase travel bookings and drive yield, says TA boss John O'Sullivan. Research shows TA's target customers are 'increasingly turning to online travel agencies when it comes to booking travel', he says. The first year of the agreement will focus on major campaign activity in the USA and UK, and while marketing activities will be extended to additional markets over the course of the deal it's understood it will mainly focus on long-haul.

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QF Back To The Sunshine Coast

Sunshine Coast Destination Ltd is hailing the return Qantas flights to Maroochydore Airport after a break of more than 10 years.

QF announced yesterday afternoon it will return to the Sunshine Coast-Sydney route from 21 Dec, offering six flights a week catering to leisure travellers, and moving to a more business-friendly schedule in Feb. The QantasLink flights will be operated by a two-class B717, offering Q-Streaming in-flight entertainment. One-way launch fares ex SYD start from AUD89, for sales to 28 Jul.

The service will add more than 68,000 seats and bring a 'new dimension' to the local tourism sector, says SCDL boss Simon Ambrose.

"Last year we attracted 9.2% domestic growth, and with major infrastructure development happening throughout the region, as well as increases in conference and events capacity, the QF

services will find an instant market, as well as encouraging more international travellers to connect to the coast," says Ambrose. "QF's international reach is very important, and by adding the Sunshine Coast to its network will allow us to market more strongly in Asia, Europe and America. Last year, we grew the international market by a record 15.7%, and with the new Qantas services as well as growth in Air New Zealand direct services, we believe we can grow the inbound market even further."

QF also announced that it will launch flights between Melbourne and the Gold Coast from 25 Oct, with daily 737 services.

NYC Airport Strikes

More than 1000 security offices, baggage handlers and wheelchair attendants were reportedly set to walk off the job for 24 hours from 2200 Wed (local time) at John F Kennedy and La Guardia Airports.

The airport workers are attempting to form a recognised union, and will picket and hold rallies at both airports. Airlines including Delta, American Airlines and United have reportedly said they aren't expecting any significant disruptions from the walk-out.

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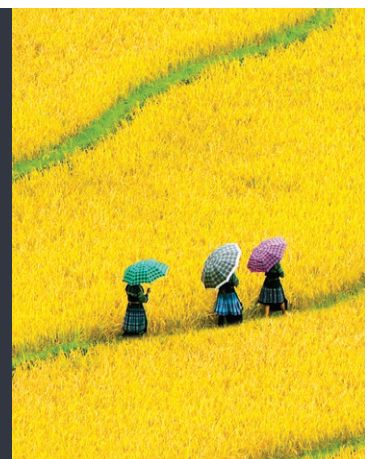
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Wi-Fi At Sea; Myths Dispelled

Some of the examples Ostebo gave were that Wi-Fi is now more available on cruises at reasonable prices. Take Disney Cruise Lines who offer guests Connect@Sea, a service that charges based on data use instead of by the minute.

Then there's the like of Carnival Cruise Line where half the fleet offer social media packages that allow guests access to popular sites such as Facebook and Twitter for a low flat fee per day.

Ostebo says almost all cruise lines offer an Internet Café complete with pay-as-you-use options for guests to stay connected.

Then there's a range of cruise lines who offer Internet access for loyalty program members. Royal Caribbean International's Crown and Anchor Society loyalty members get discounts on internet packages, whilst Silversea guests sailing in select suites enjoy unlimited free Wi-Fi and every guest receives at least one free hour of Wi-Fi per day, Ostebo says.

"There are common misconceptions that Wi-Fi capabilities on cruise ships are expensive, unreliable or non-existent," he says. "We are happy to dispel that myth and prove that connectivity and cruising are not mutually exclusive."

Mechanical Fire

A mechanical fire broke out in Royal Caribbean International's Freedom of the Seas yesterday as she was pulling into Falmouth, Jamaica. In an official statement the cruise line says the ship's fire suppression system was immediately activated, which contained and extinguished the fire. "In an abundance of caution, the Captain mustered all guests at their assembly stations. All guests and crew have been accounted for. There have been no reported injuries to any guests but one crew member was treated for first-degree burns," it says. The ship is currently alongside in Falmouth and all systems are functioning. It is nearing the end of its seven-night sailing that departed Cape Canaveral, Florida on 19 Jul, including port calls to Labadee, Haiti; Falmouth, Jamaica; George Town, Grand Cayman, Cozumel, Mexico.
