



## **HX Australia Flights**

Hong Kong Airlines will launch its first thrice-weekly service to Australia next year, commencing on 08 Jan. The new 'triangular' service travels from Hong Kong to Gold Coast, then stops in Cairns en route back to Hong Kong.

The A330 flights will operate on Tue, Fri and Sat, with 292 seats including 32 in business class.

# Cooks Removes Need For Dep. Cards

Passengers leaving the Cook Islands no longer have to fill out a departure form, with the government deciding the extra step isn't necessary as the information is captured electronically anyway.

Passengers will now only need to check in and follow normal security checks before immigration processing. They will still need to declare if they are carrying \$10,000 or more in cash

The move is part of the government's efforts to improve the tourist experience, says Prime Minister Henry Puna.

### **Mercure Newcastle**

The Mercure Newcastle Airport has officially opened in Port Stephens, NSW. The AUD15 million, 95-room new build hotel features sound-proofed guestrooms with high-speed broadband, blackout blinds, Foxtel and smart TVs. There's family rooms which can sleep four people, a modern 24-hour gym, Mach One Restaurant and Bar, and four purpose-built conference rooms. Room rates start from AUD150pn.

"Over the previous four years we have included the departure tax in the ticket, removed the need for international visitors to acquire a driver's license, and now we will remove the departure card. These are little things but when we add them together we see that the cumulative impact is a large one."

### EY To Be Sued?

Etihad is reportedly being sued by a man who claimed that being seated in economy next to an overweight passenger during a flight from Dubai to Sydney left him with back injuries. The disgruntled passenger claims he had to 'contort and twist' his body to avoid contact with the man sitting next to him, who also coughed frequently and 'expelled fluid from his mouth' during the flight in Oct 2011.

EY has tried to have the case dismissed; arguing that it isn't liable as any injuries sustained would not be the result of an accident. The passenger, as directed by court, will have a medical assessment in Dec, which EY believes will see the matter 'proceed to an early conclusion'.

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# Fitting A Check-up Into A Port Call



## Hajj Pilgrimage

Over two million Muslim pilgrims are expected to visit Mecca in Saudi Arabia to perform the Hajj in late Sep. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade advises New Zealanders taking part to register their details and have insurance cover before they leave. It also advises Kiwis to follow instructions issued by the local authorities; safeguard valuables from theft; obey all bans on filming or photography or risk having equipment confiscated; pay particular attention to hygiene measures recommended by the World Health Organisation; and to find out if any vaccines or other medical precautions are required. ## **India Regains Rating**

India has complied with international safety standards set by the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) and has been granted a Category 1 rating under the FAA's International Aviation Safety Assessment (IASA) program, advises the agency. A Category 1 rating means that the country's civil aviation authority complies with ICAO standards and permits India's air carriers to add flights to the United States using their own aircraft and carry the code of US carriers on their operations. India first achieved a Category 1 rating in Aug 1997. A Dec 2012 FAA audit identified some deficiencies in the DGCA from ICAO-set global standards for oversight of aviation safety which led to a Category 2 designation. Subsequently, the FAA began a reassessment of India's compliance with ICAO standards under the FAA's IASA program.

## **New For Turkey**

## **Dubai's Popularity Soars**

Dubai's ongoing efforts to position itself as a premier leisure and business hub have resulted in growing visitor numbers as well as higher rankings on various global traveller and meeting indexes. Recently MasterCard announced Dubai has risen to fourth out of 132 top destinations for international travellers in the Master-Card Global Destination Cities Index, behind London, Paris and Bangkok. It also retained its top ranking in the Middle East for international association meetings, and climbed 19 places to 44th in the 2014 International Congress & Convention Association World Rankings. Meanwhile in a report published by the Union of International Associations, Dubai jumped to 14th for the number of international meetings hosted. It hosted 146 meetings in 2014, compared to 80 in 2013. Officially, the city welcomed 13.2 million international overnight travellers in 2014, up 8.4% on 2013. The purpose of visits, although dominated by leisure at 59%, saw over 21% visiting for business, and another 17% VFR.
