### Low fares at peak times Sunshine Coast: Business As Usual More China Flights? Tianjin Airlines is reportedly looking to join the ranks of carriers adding direct flights between China and New

Visit Sunshine Coast (VSC) is in New Zealand this week reassuring trade partners it's committed to the market and will appoint new representation soon, following the announcement that local rep Kate Wright is moving on.

Wright will finish with the RTO mid-Jul to take up a new role with Tourism WA, which has led to some speculation in the industry around whether VSC plans to continue in-market representation here.

However international and domestic trade manager Rachel Meyer has quickly downplayed any such rumours, and says Wright's departure won't have any impact on VSC's plans for New Zealand.

"For us at VSC, New Zealand is our number one international source



market, it represents around 25% of our overall international market share with more than 62,000 visitors each year, so we're here to reaffirm to our key industry trade partners our commitment to the market," she says.

"We're also meeting with potential new candidates for New Zealand representation and looking forward to reappointing very soon so we can continue on with the great work that Kate had put in place."

With Air New Zealand recently moving from three to four flights a week on the Auckland-Sunshine Coast route, the RTO recognises that it's as important as ever to remain visible to Kiwi travellers.

"We've got an increased capacity of 10% on that service, so it's a great opportunity to continue to grow our market share," she says.

#### ... Roadshow

There's plenty planned to keep the momentum going in the coming months, including a VSC roadshow scheduled to take place in Oct, says Meyer. "2016/17 is set to be an exciting year ahead for VSC in the New Zealand market, we have plans in place to activate some exciting campaigns to be announced shortly, and to bring a VSC delegation to New Zealand," says Meyer.

"VSC would like to sincerely thank Kate for her amazing efforts," she Meyer added.

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# **Jetstar, Virgin Big** Aircraft Orders



Jetstar Pacific and Virgin Atlantic are among the carriers to confirm large aircraft orders at the Farnborough Air Show this week, with both Boeing and Airbus announcing significant business.

Virgin Atlantic has picked the A350-1000 to become the next aircraft in its fleet, operating from London, with eight of the aircraft on order for deliveries commencing 2019, and four new aircraft on long term leases from ALC from 2020. The aircraft will be deployed initially at LHR to strengthen the transatlantic network on existing business routes, and subsequently at LGW on leisure routes to the Caribbean, in a three-class configuration.

derstanding (MOU) for 10 A320ceo aircraft, boosting its existing fleet of 12 leased A320 Family aircraft.

"This agreement marks a milestone in our development," says airline boss Le Hong Ha. "The new aircraft will allow us to expand our operation on our international network from Vietnam as part of the wider Jetstar Group."

Other Airbus orders included a firm order for three A350-900s and one A321 for Air Lease Corporation; Air Côte d'Ivoire ordered an extra A320neo; and ARKIA Israeli Airlines will receive up to four A330-900neo aircraft.

Boeing too announced significant business at the show, including an MoU with Xiamen Airlines for up to 30 737 MAX 200 aircraft; Donghai Airlines' intention to buy 25 737 MAX 8s and five 787-9s; and Standard Chartered Bank ordered 10 Next-Gen 737-800s to grow its Aviation Finance business.

# NZ 787-9 To The Islands

Air New Zealand is to introduce its 787-9 Dreamliner on flights to Tahiti, Samoa, Tonga and Rarotonga, replacing current 767-300 services, in an effort to provide 'a more consistent product offering across our international network'.

The 787-9 will launch 31 Oct on AKL-PPT, with all flights moving to the 787-9 (except Fri flights 16 Dec-27 Jan). The move increases capacity by 31% for the season and introduces Skycouch as well as Premium Economy on a permanent basis.

The first Dreamliner service on AKL-RAR is set for 30 Oct, with most NZ45/46 flights to be operated by 787-9.

AKL-APW flights will see the 787-9 from 04 Nov, with most wide-body flights to be operated by 787-9 with the remaining on 777-200 services. From Mar, NZ will offer daily flights operated by a variety of aircraft on the route.

On the AKL-TBU route, the first scheduled 787-9 operation is from 02 Dec, with most wide-body flights to be operated by 787-9 and the remaining on 777-200.

The updated schedule will be available for sales through the GDS in due course, says NZ.

### QF Australia Sale

Qantas has flights to Australia on sale until 15 Jul, with one-way flights to Sydney, Melbourne and Brisbane priced from \$199 in economy and \$599 in business.

Royal Caribbean's Ovation of the Seas will 'make a pretty big statement' when it arrives in New Zealand, says Cruise World's Cherryl Browne, who has recently returned from attending the ship's naming ceremony in Beijing.

"It was a real privilege and such an eye-opener to get a true sense of the physicality of one of these huge RCI Quantum class ships. To say they are impressive is an understatement," she says.

Browne says highlights included the evening entertainment shows; the activities onboard, such as the North Star which offers a bird's eye view above and over the ship and the Flow Rider and Dodgem activities; while the Oasis multi-level pool area is a great place for those looking to relax. She adds that most of the public areas for dining, activities and facilities are on six decks, and that the central bank of lifts easily copes with the large numbers of people moving throughout the ship.
