Travel Is The Secret To True Happiness

While couples around the country celebrate Valentine's Day it's timely to point to new research which claims it's travel, not romance, that is the key to true happiness.

Booking.com's global survey of some 17,000 people included some 1000 from New Zealand—and the Kiwi results mirror the global findings.

Some 44% of the Kiwis polled said travel was more important to their happiness than getting a new job; 39% saw travel as more important than their wedding day; for 38% travelling was more important than getting engaged. But wait, there's more—some 31% of the Kiwis surveyed declared travel was more important than having a baby.

Participants from 17 countries around the globe participated in the survey, says Booking.com, which found that travel gives people such a powerful emotional boost that those polled, including Kiwis, consider go-

ing away on holiday more vital to our happiness than other big life events.

... Selling Tool?

For agents looking to convert client interest into bookings—perhaps try to use the happiness factor as a sales tool.

Booking.com says the survey also revealed that 69% of Kiwis agreed that travel experiences bring more lasting happiness than material things.

"Based on a decade of research, the greatest competitive advantage of the modern world is a positive brain," says 'happiness expert' Shawn Anchor. "In fact I recently found that people who take all of their vacation days are not only happier, they are 34% more likely to receive a bonus over the next three years. Happy travel pays."

EK Single-Aisle?

Emirates is reportedly considering buying small single-aisle aircraft, a marked departure for the carrier which currently relies on twin-aisle A380s and 777s. EK boss Tim Clark told *CNN* that there's three options the carrier is considering over the next 18 months—whether to stick to large twin-aisle aircraft, add single-aisle aircraft like A320s and 737s, or combine them with smaller twin-aisle jets. It's been more than 20 years since EK flew a single-aisle jet, according to *CNN*.

Clark added that EK has reduced its fares 'to the point of stupidity' in the last few years as oil prices have dropped, and that the carrier is having a 'difficult time in global economics'.

EK Seat Res In The GDS

Agents can sell Emirates advanced seat reservation in Travelport and Sabre from tomorrow, with Amadeus to follow shortly. The carrier launched seat reservation on-line last Oct, and following strong demand from agents has been working with GDS partners to deliver the same functionality in the GDS. Customers booking Economy Class Special or Economy Class Saver fares will pay a charge if they wish to select their preferred seat before check-in opens. This applies to booking classes X, V, T, L, Q and N on both revenue and redemption bookings. For details see emiratesagents.com

Transavia Changes

KLM's low-cost subsidiary Transavia will drop flights from Munich at the end of Oct, and focus instead on growing its home markets in the Netherlands and France. Air France-KLM boss Jean Marc Janaillac says the move will result in a stronger proposition in the Dutch market, and allow Transavia to reallocate resources to accelerate the change.

Record WLG Pax Expected In 2017

Wellington Airport is bracing itself for a big year with significant events drawings crowds to the capital set to tip annual passenger numbers over the six million milestone—two years earlier than forecast.

The number of travellers is expected to hit a peak this month thanks to the Guns 'n Roses concert and Black Caps vs South Africa cricket test and one-day match adding to an already busy period. Meanwhile, later in the year the airport is anticipating a further increase in passenger flows with the British and Irish Lions tour games in Jun/Jul and the Rugby League World Cup quarter final.

In 2012 the airport reached five million passengers and anticipated hosting six million in 2019, however, since then numbers have risen and forecasts suggest the record will be reached this year.

Passenger numbers have been lifted by new Jetstar, Fiji Airways and Singapore Airlines routes, increases in capacity from both Air New Zealand and Qantas and new services from Sounds Air; while last year international passenger volumes grew by 16% to 900,000.

Cook Is, SIN Agreement

The Cook Islands and Singapore have reportedly signed an Air Services Agreement, in a move that is expected to eventually lead to air connectivity between the nations, according to *Radio New Zealand*. It is thought the agreement will also allow improved access for the Cook Islands to the Singaporean tourism market.

Cathay Pacific and partner airline Cathay Dragon have flights to destinations in Asia on sale until 27 Feb. Fares start from \$979 to destinations such as Ho Chi Minh, Siem Reap and Phuket. Flights are valid for departures 14 Feb-31 Oct. See cxagents.com/nz



Emirates Exposes Its Cargo Of Roses

It's Valentine's Day, which means millions of roses have been making their way around the world in the belly of aircraft—including this Emirates Sky-Cargo Boeing 777-F freighter, which has received a special decal to mark the occasion. EK transports fresh flowers across its network every day, including from New Zealand, and last year it's estimated to have carried more than 70,000 tonnes. There's a marked increase in the number of flowers, especially roses, transported for Valentine's Day, and EK adds extra capacity on the major flower trade lanes to bring the flowers to Aalsmeer, the world's largest flower auction house in Amsterdam. Meanwhile Heathrow says almost eight million stems of roses, or 570 tonnes, will be imported in Feb—three times more than on an average month. Almost 93% of fresh cut roses imported to the UK arrive on aircraft.

HA Pilots Pay Rise

Hawaiian Airlines has reached a tentative agreement with the Air Line Pilots Association, which includes a 'significant increase in compensation'. HA has been negotiating with the union over pay since Sep 2015. The 63-month agreement covers the airline's 665 pilots, who will vote on the agreement in Mar.

DL had originally planned to offer MXN43.59 per share, but is now offering MXN53 due to 'exchange rate movements and other factors'. The MXN has hit record lows since the US election.






