



# Royal Wedding Showcases Britain To Kiwi Tavellers

The royal wedding is upon us, and in the lead up to the nuptials London's icons have been polished and spruced in anticipation.

VisitBritain's New Zealand representative Sally Holyer says the intense focus on Prince William and Kate Middleton has also put the spotlight on the rest of Britain, in particular the spots around the country that the pair have been known to frequent—from country pubs to flashy London nightclubs.

"This young modern couple cover all of Britain, they met in Scotland and of course they're going to live in Anglesey, North Wales. The wedding is also a perfect opportunity to showcase Britain's history and heritage from this perspective," she says.

Holyer says the build up to the wedding and of course the coverage of the big day itself is expected to give British tourism a boost, as people around the world watch London and want to visit for themselves—creating the perfect opportunity for agents to sell Britain and its historic destinations.

"Whilst we're not promoting the wedding itself, we expect to see an increase in demand over the next year, as the destination is put on display," says Holyer. "The tour route the newlyweds will take after their wedding is a historic path and it covers so many of London's icons, it's sure to encourage visitors."

The royal festivities continue into 2012, the year of the Queen's Diamond Jubilee. VisitBritain New Zealand rep Sally Holyer says the Jubilee celebrations are another opportunity for the trade to upsell the popular destination.

"It's going to be a whole year of celebrations and events around the country, as well as the main event over the weekend of 02-05 Jun. It's lovely to have an event to talk about because there are heritage and royal spots all over the country," she says. "Agents can capitalise on all things royal—the Three Palace Pass, the London Pass, that allows the consumer to get great value for money when visiting royal or heritage spots. And of course the Great British Heritage Pass," she adds.

tions are still 'very much' a key part of Kiwi's UK itineraries.

"When we see statistics on what Kiwis do, it's the heritage, royal and museums at the top of the list so it's very much a large part of what Kiwis experience. We also know that Kiwis travel more across the country, rather than sticking to London," she adds.

Holyer adds that the Jun celebrations tie nicely into the countdown to the London Olympics, which begins five weeks later on 27 Jul 2012.

#### **Diamond Jubilee Pass**

VisitBritain will offer UK-bound clients the chance to buy a Diamond Pass in celebration of the Queen's Diamond Jubilee in 2012. The Jubilee celebrations are officially 02-05 Jun (with Mon 04 and Tue 05 Jun public holidays for Brits). The Diamond Pass will offer up to 40% off gate entry prices to nearly 60 top historic sites next year, with prices yet to be announced. However, the Great British Heritage Passes are available now, offering discounted entry to nearly 500 historic sites around Britain starting from \$85 for a three-day pass, to \$258.50 for a 30-day option.
