As Hawaii gets ready to say Aloha to non-stop flights from New Zealand in the not-too-distant future, Hawaii Tourism has taken the time to honour the island state's roots and embrace the Hawaiian concept of malama, which is taking care of the people and place.

"Malama will play a prominent role in the Hawai'i Tourism Authority's strategic direction of regenerative tourism, built around the key pillars of environment, community, culture and brand marketing," says Hawaii Tourism New Zealand manager Darragh Walshe.

"Kiwis have a natural understanding of malama, particularly due to the similar Maori concept of manaaki," he adds.

Walshe says pre C-19 Kiwi travellers showed a tendency to explore beyond the hot-spots and seek authentic interactions with the community,



culture and environment-and this is something the STO is looking to leverage as travel to the rainbow state rebuilds from New Zealand.

Hawaii still offers its combination of rich heritage and stunning natural wonders juxtaposed with its wide range of shops and culinary options—but with conscious travel set to Malama Hawaii is designed to help travellers give back to the communities they visit.

The programme features nearly 100 businesses and volunteer organisations which help restore, perpetuate and regenerate Hawaii's places, landscapes and natural resources through their volunteer efforts. The resort's carbon neutral certification will be verified by DEKRA, which is the only recognised international standard for carbon neutrality. This year. The resort is hoping to eliminate carbon emission from sources such as propane, gasoline, diesel, and refrigerants as well as electricity.
