A Foodies Guide To Hawaii's Cuisine

Hawaii has been described as a multi-cultural food mecca, and for clients who want to sample the best dishes, here's a list of the Rainbow State's best foodie neighbourhoods.


Hilo, on the Island of Hawaii, is famed for its daily-catch fish and multi-ethnic comfort food. The must-try dish here is loco moco; white rice, topped with a hamburger patty, a fried egg and gravy. Also recommended is the neighbourhoods's poke shops, as well as its family okazuyas and farm-andfarmers-market-to-table bistros.

Over in Oahu, Kaimuki is among the recommended foodie neighbourhoods, home to inventive restaurants, brewpubs, takeout spots and dessert havens.

The neighbourhood's Waialae Ave is the go to, home to an array of unique eateries as well as independent boutique retailers for those hoping to get some shopping in as well.

In Downtown Honolulu and the Chinatown District residential hub Kakaako has seen a growing mix of groovy new eateries and bars. Clients will find everything from modern ramen, poke and yakitori to pubs and pizza here.

Maui has an array of foodie neighbourhoods that agents can recom-





mend, but Wailuku is the number one. Described as a comfort food haven, Wailuku's Market Street is famed for its collection of time-tested family owned eateries.

Over to Kauai, Lihue tops the list for eateries, home to a range of longtime single-owner restaurants, bakeries, saimin stands, poke shops, shave ice stands and food trucks, all of which are big on comfort food.

Hawaii Unmasked

Hawaii's Safe Travels programme for domestic travellers to and from the US ends 25 Mar.

This means that effective 26 Mar. passengers arriving from the continental US will not be required to create a Safe Travels account, show their C-19 vaccination status, or take a pre-travel test when traveling to Hawaii. Passengers arriving to Hawaii on direct international flights must still adhere to federal US entry requirements, which include showing proof of an up-todate vaccination document and negative pre-travel C-19 test result taken within one day of travel. Punctual HA Wins Again



Hawaiian Airlines has once again been crowned America's most punctual carrier in 2021, with the U.S. Department of Transportation revealing the airline has an average 90.1% on-time rate, exceeding the US industry average by nine percentage points.

This is the 18th consecutive year HA has taken home the title, with ceo Peter Ingram crediting his team for the result. "Our recovery is a testament to their tireless efforts, and I'm truly honored to be a part of this airline," he says.

Waipio Closure

Agents are advised that Waipio Valley Road has been closed to visitors, with Hawaii County citing safety concerns. The Island of Hawaii Visitors Bureau (IHVB) fully supports the County of Hawaii's decision to close Waipio Valley Road to visitors until further notice, with executive director Ross Birch saying it has not promoted traversing into the Valley for more than a decade now, due to the community's concerns about tourism's impacts on this sacred and culturally significant place. "We continue to do all we can to steer the direction of tourism for our island with the community's well-being top of mind."
