Holidays & History On Hawaii Island

Clients looking for an insight into Hawaii's history are recommended Hawaii Island, home to preserved indigenous sites, royal estates and multiple museums covering everything from Hawaii's nature to its cowboys.

Topping the list is indigenous sites, with Hawaii Island home to two of the best historic parks in Hawaii, including Puuhonua o Honaunau National Historical Park, where clients will find a hale poki (sacred house) and carved wooden kii (statues).

The other is Kaloko-Honokohau National Historical Park, which boasts kii pohaku (petroglyphs) and heiau (religious sites).

Target's Waikiki Debut

Slack Guitar Festival

The 31st Annual Hawaiian Slack Key Guitar Festival is coming to the island group, with some of Hawaii's best slack guitar artists set to perform at events from Jun to Nov.

The festival, said a must-attend cultural event during the summer in Hawaii, will be in Maui on 26 Jun at the Maui Arts & Culture Center, and in Oahu at the Waikiki Aquarium on 13 Aug.

Suntory Re-Opens



Suntory, Oahu's famed Japanese restaurant, has reopened in Waikiki following a multi-million dollar makeover.

The redesigned restaurant offers multiple Japanese dining experiences, such as teppanyaki (cooking in front of diners on a flat iron grill), kaiseki (traditional multicourse meals emphasising seasonal ingredients), nabe (shabu shabu or sukiyaki style hot pot), and other types of washoku (Japanese cuisine favourites like tempura, grilled fish, soba/udon noodles, and more).

There's a new sushi counter, which is now an omakase-style experience, which means chefs will create sushi for guests right in front of them, with sake and wine pairings also available.

Pint & Jigger Reopens



Pint & Jigger is re-opening at a new location in Ala Moana Hotel, with its Speakeasy, Harry's Hardware Emporium, to also debut.

The popular bar is famed in Hawaii as one of the first bars to curate both craft beer and craft cocktails 'on the highest level' under one roof.

It boasts an ever-rotating tap selection from local and international breweries, a festive beer garden, and one of the most extensive whiskey collections in the state as well as a menu with specialties such as the beer cheese and butter-basted oatmeal stout burgers. Meanwhile, the 1920's themed speakeasy Harry's Hardware Emporium offers clients the chance to enjoy cocktails or wine alongside 'sophisticated fare'.
