## Where To Find The Best Big Isle Luaus

A Hawaiian Luau is a must-do for any holiday to the Aloha State, including on Hawaii Island

Mauna Lani, an Auberge Collection Resort, hosts a Hale Hoaloha Luau every Fri, celebrating the beauty and stories of the area, known as Kalahuipua'a.

Highlights include traditional Hawaiian foods such as lomi lomi salmon and huli huli style chicken, as well as a traditional imu ceremony in the morning, Hawaiian makahiki games for children, live music and hula during dinner, and after dark, a fireknife finale.

Located on the beachfront in Kamakahonu Bay, highlights include Hawaiian inspired cuisine, including a kalua pig, an open bar, hula lessons, storytelling, a Royal Court Procession, and Polynesian performances.

Prices start from USD169 per adult, with children aged four- to 12-years from USD84.50 excluding tax.

On the South Kohala Coast the Fairmont Orchid, hosts The Hawai'iloa Luau every Sat.

The luau's buffet dinner is prepared by an award-winning culinary team, as well as an internationally-renowned cast of performers sharing the stories of Hawai'i through live music and hula.

Other highlights include the chance to meet the performers before the



show and learn about the traditional games and cultural practices, and a hosted bar. Prices start from USD159 for adults and USD79.50 for children aged six- to 12-years, not including tax. See details HERE.
