Kauai may be known for its lush scenery, but the Garden Isle also boasts a wide range of water activities from kayaking and surfing to whale watching and more.

Kauai features the only navigable rivers in Hawaii and the Wailua River along the east coast is the most popular choice for kayakers; while the Huleia River from Nawiliwili Harbor in Lihue, as well as the Hanalei River on the North Shore, are also recommended. Clients seeking a challenge can attempt ocean kayaking, with the go to spots including the South Shore's Poipu to Port Allen course, and the 17-mile Napali Coast route, for which a guide is a must.

waves, send clients to Poipu and Kalapaki, while the experienced can attempt the island's North Shore breaks, which attract world champion surfers every Nov-Feb.

The island also offers stand-up paddle boarding, with Hanalei Bay, Poipu Beach or Kalapaki Beach popular for calm waters; and board rentals and lessons easily are available throughout the island.

Those Hawaii-bound Dec to May can add whale watching to their itinerary, with humpback whales migrating to Hawaiian waters every year to breed and give birth to new calves. Clients can schedule a tour or charter a boat, or head to popular land-based vantage points such as Poipu Beach, Kilauea Lighthouse and the Napali Coast's Kalalau Trail on the North Shore.

For those looking to explore Kauai's marine life, there are also numerous snorkelling and scuba spots for agents to recommend.

Send clients keen on snorkelling to the North Shore, with the reefs off Kee Beach and Haena Beach Park the go-to, as well as Anini Beach and Makua Beach in Haena. On the East Side, Lydgate Beach Park is recommended, as well as Poipu Beach State Park on the South Shore. For scuba, the top spots include Hanalei, Kee Beach, or Poipu Beach.
